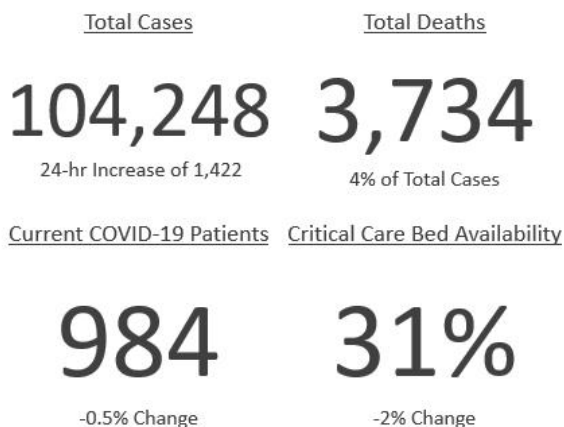
Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 1,422 (104,248) total new cases, 141 (11,901) hospitalizations, 26 (3,734) deaths, and 22 (2,721) ICU admissions, which were all above the 21-day averages.

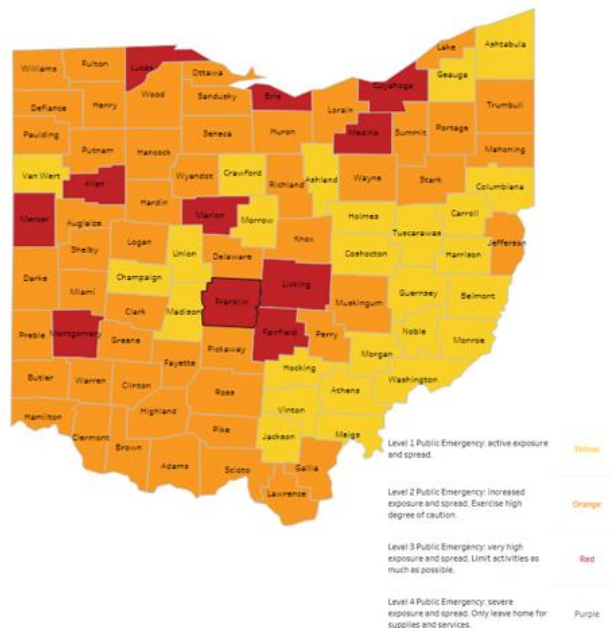
Warehouse capacity continues to be monitored as inbound supplies increase. State stockpiling and storage strategies continue to be developed through ESF-7 and the State EOC Unified Command.

State Community Lifeline Status

In-state Response | Ongoing External Support | Assistance Needed

Primary Lifeline



- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase.
- 7-day moving average of case by onset date steadily increased from mid-June to early July, with a modest decrease in recent weeks.
- Positivity rate has plateaued in recent weeks.
- Reproduction number is now ranging between 0.79-0.89 in the three clinical zones.
- ED visits showed a sustained increase from mid June to Mid July, followed by a sustained decline through early August.
- Limited access to nursing homes & similar facilities continues.
- Personal Protective Equipment, Mass Fatality, and Medical Surge workgroups continue efforts.
- One active RRF remain in-progress; 13 addressed and are no longer active.



- The Agriculture workgroup continues to monitor for issues of concern.
- All major pork processing plants impacting Ohio's processing are operating (statewide & nationally).
- Pork depopulation planning continues on account of processing interruption.
- Restaurants are open per the ODH Dine Safe Ohio Order (current as of May 21)
- Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues.
- Potential quarantine locations have been identified.
- Homelessness workgroup continues to update plans for response.



- First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19. (ODH Order)
- Limited access to jails & detention facilities continues.
- ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across their statewide facilities.



- No current impacts to the lifeline requiring EOC support.



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State EOC Objectives

1. Coordinate the State's response to limit COVID-19 spread and maintain Lifeline stability.
2. Provide mission support to identify, prevent, mitigate and respond to COVID-19 hot spots.
3. Develop PPE procurement, warehousing, and allotment strategies to meet current and projected needs.
4. Share timely, clear, and consistent information to the whole community, especially as it pertains to recovery programs.

1 | Transportation

- Ohio Department of Transportation

Actions Taken:

- Completed the KN90 respirator mission in Toledo Erie.
- Picked up two loads of water in Mansfield today, one was delivered to Alum Creek and the other one will be delivered August 13.

Planned Actions:

- Plan to provide two trucks to support the water mission tomorrow and Friday.
- Reaching out to the districts for drivers for the Monday PPE Push.

8 | Public Health

- Ohio Department of Health

Actions Taken:

- ODH has retained a consultant for After Action Review and Strategic Planning for the second wave. A presentation is being provided to the Pandemic Leadership Team for dialogue and guidance.
- Planning is well underway for the ODH Bureau of Infectious Diseases in preparation of receipt and distribution of COVID-19 Vaccine.
- The RSS Warehouse in collaboration with ESF-1 is planning the 25th PPE Push consisting of gowns and gloves for early next week to 88 counties.
- Zone 1: There have been 27 new outbreaks reported across the zone since Monday; the majority of which are attributed to community spread with cases ranging from high school sports teams, to restaurants, home repair companies, and a law firm. There was also a second outbreak of note at a nursing home (Lima Manor in Allen County) that had already fully recovered from a previous COVID-19 outbreak earlier during the pandemic.
- Zone 3: Hospitals are reporting a slight uptick in COVID-19 cases as overall hospital occupancy is trending up, with an increase in ICU Adult bed use.
- 300,000 masks are being pushed out within the SW Region today, these masks will ultimately be distributed through educational services into the schools.
- Mass Fatality Branch continues to work with DAS to identify staffing solutions for attentive care sites in the event of their activation.
- During this operational period ESF-8 Desk has not initiated any mission requests with State partners.

Planned Actions:

- ESF-8 will participate in the FEMA Region V Synchronization Meeting 13 Aug 20.
- ODH will conduct the ESF-8 Partners Touchpoint 13 Aug 20.
- ODH continues to collaborate on daily planning efforts and provide guidance and information to various ESF-8 partners and stakeholders.

- Aging/State Long-Term Care Ombudsman

Actions Taken:

- Supported residential care facility registration for COVID-19 testing strategy through phone calls to providers and responses to questions.

Planned Actions:

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- Participate in ESF-8 Partner Touch Point.

- ODRC has 1005 staff COVID-19 positive, 889 staff recovered, 116 active positives and 5 deaths.
- ODRC has 336 incarcerated adults COVID-19 active positive, 4,343 recovered and 77 deaths, 22,166 total tested.
- ODRC Special Operations team members working at Chillicothe Correctional Institution for a security mission and Chillicothe Correctional Institution Madison Correctional Institution and Southern Ohio Correctional Facility for medical missions.
- Ohio State Highway Patrol assisting with perimeter security at Chillicothe Correctional Institution activated July 23, 2020.
- ODRC continues to have hot spots with staff and inmates positive COVID-19.

- 11 medical personnel are caring for patients at a Richland County nursing home.

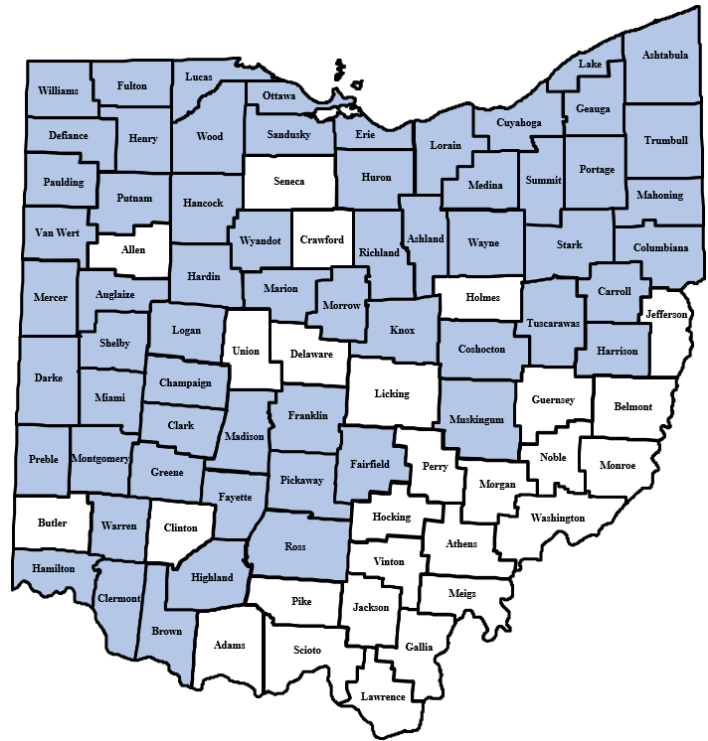
- 36 pax are working in the RSS warehouse moving PPE.

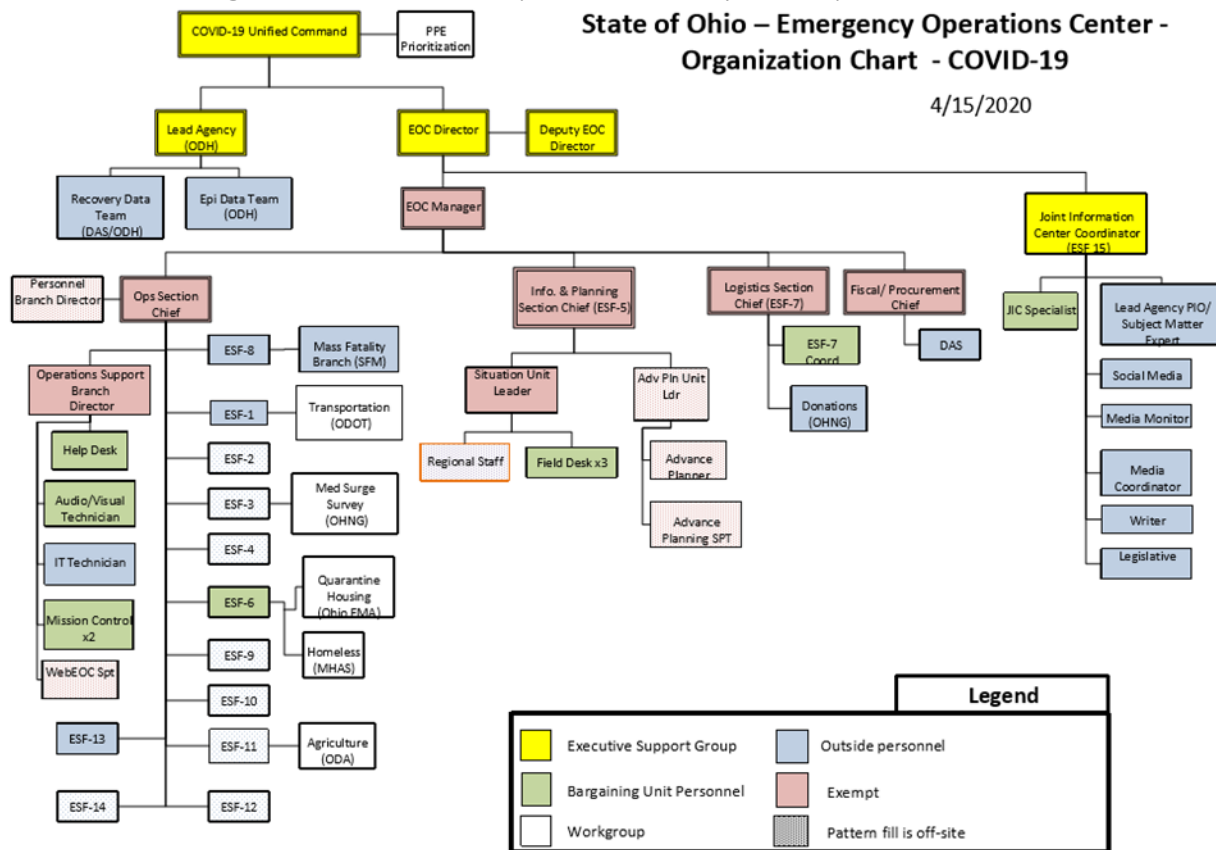
