Current Situation:

Public Health – Dayton & Montgomery County, the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and World Health Organization (WHO) continued to respond to the COVID-19 Pandemic.

Current Updates:

- It needs to be continually enforced that we are still in the middle of a pandemic. Enforce social distancing, hand-washing and the wear of masks.
- Sit-reps will now come out every two weeks.
- Globally the World now has 24,335,281 cases and 811,209 deaths from COVID-19.
- 6 counties as of last Thursday fall under a level 3 (red) category.
- Montgomery County remains at a level 3 (red) category.
- Public Health conducted pop-up testing at Dixie Twin Drive-in on Tuesday, September 1, 2020. A total of 453 individuals were tested with 24 positive a 5.3% positivity rate.
- All pop-up testing has been canceled for the next two weeks as we respond to the UD outbreak.
- Public Health is training 100 additional staff to respond to the current outbreak at UD.
- The next tentative pop-up site is scheduled for September 22 at the Bethesda Temple at 3701 Salem Ave, Dayton. Additional information will be shared as it becomes available.
- Interim final rule, additional policy and regulatory revisions in response to the COVID-19 PH emergency related to LTC facility testing requirements has been released.
 - Routine testing of staff is based on positivity rate within the county

- Travel advisory issued: Individuals traveling to Ohio from 6 states urged to selfquarantine for 14 days.
 - o These include Nevada, North Dakota, South Dakota, Iowa, Kansas and Alabama

- 4 million KN-95 masks for schools are projected to arrive in the state from FEMA to be shared with school districts.
- The county drop-site is now being fully staffed by individuals from St. Vincent de Paul.

- Public Health continues to meet weekly with local colleges and universities to discuss planning issues for the summer as well as the fall.
- The Public Health COVID-19 informational phone line remains open Monday through Friday to answer general questions. The info line is 937-225-6217.
- ODH information line remains open, the number is 1-833-4-ASK-ODH and is open seven days a week.
- Public Health continues to monitor all sources (ODH, CDC, WHO, European Center for Disease and Prevention and Control (ECOC) for the latest information.
- Public Health maintains its one-week operational period for this response.
- Public Health will continue to share the situational report with other local health departments, Montgomery County Emergency Management, Greater Dayton Area Hospital Association and Dayton Metropolitan Medical Response System partners.



Level 3 Travel Health Notice: Widespread ongoing transmission with restrictions on entry to the United States CDC recommends that travelers avoid all nonessential travel to the following destinations. Most foreign nationals who have been in one of these countries during the previous 14 days will not be allowed to enter the United States.
