Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 2,509 (202,740) total new cases, 20 (3,771) ICU admissions, 22 (5,239) deaths, and 198 (18,433) hospitalizations.

The State EOC is currently at Partial Activation as it continues to coordinate response to COVID-19. While the EOC is available for use by all Emergency Support Functions, ESFs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, and 15 will remain activated for the ongoing response.

The 26th push of PPE to primary county drop sites in each county will be conducted on Wednesday, October 28.

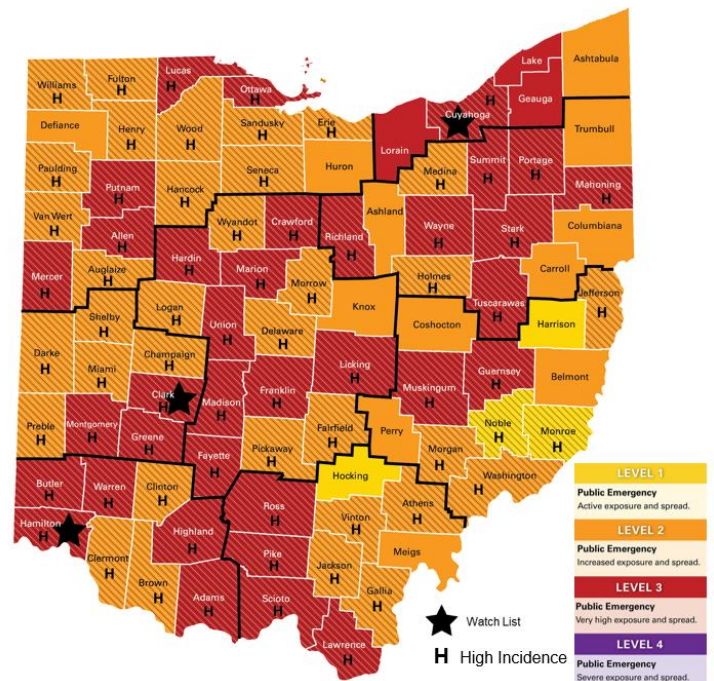

Primary Lifeline



- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase
- Three counties have been placed on the Watch List, indicating near Public Emergencies by ODH
- Very high exposure and spread conditions have been identified in 38 counties by ODH
- PPE, Mass Fatality, Medical Surge, and Vaccine Planning workgroups remain active
- One active RRF remains in-progress; 14 addressed and are no longer active.



- The Agriculture workgroup continues to monitor for issues of concern
- Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues
- [\(Potential quarantine locations\)](#) have been identified
- Homelessness workgroup continues to collaborate on response

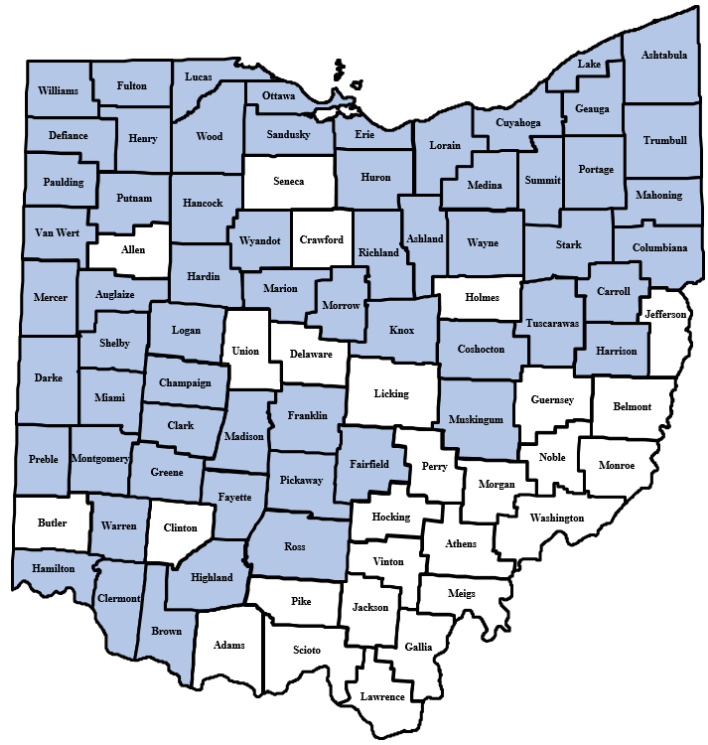

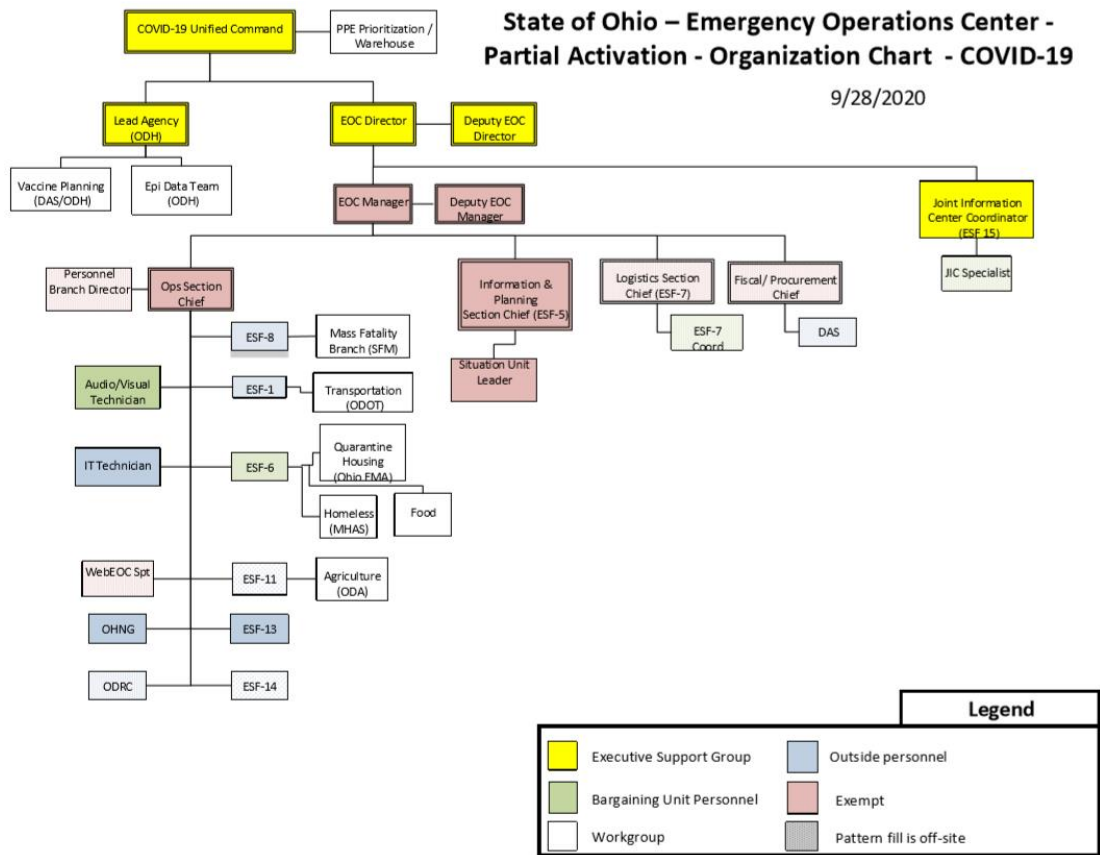
