Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 3,303 (219,000) total new cases, 17 (3,876) ICU admissions, 2 (5,303) deaths, and 88 (19,220) hospitalizations.

The State EOC is currently at Partial Activation as it continues to coordinate response to COVID-19. While the EOC is available for use by all Emergency Support Functions, ESFs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, and 15 will remain activated for the ongoing response.

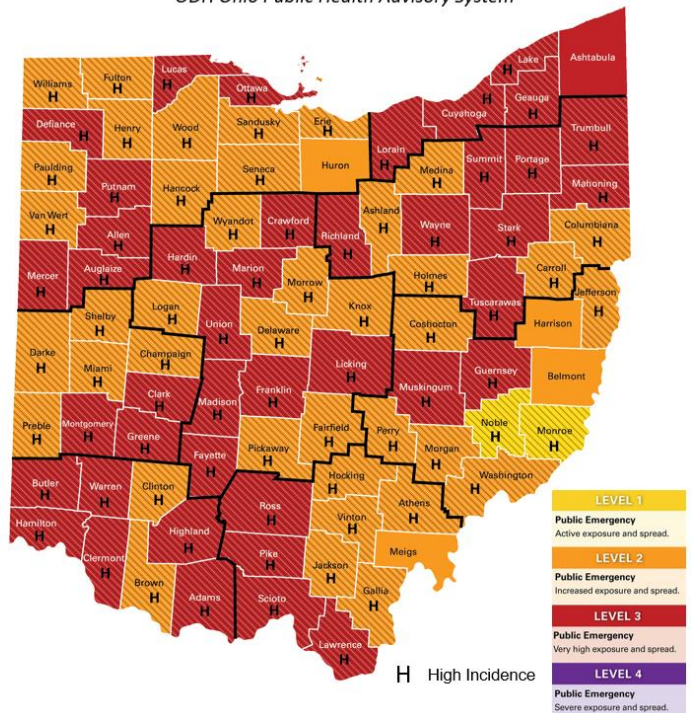

Primary Lifeline



- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase
- Very high exposure and spread conditions have been identified in 43 counties by ODH
- PPE, Mass Fatality, Medical Surge, and Vaccine Planning workgroups remain active
- Two active RRF remain in-progress; 14 addressed and are no longer active.



- The Agriculture workgroup continues to monitor for issues of concern
- Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues
- [\(Potential quarantine locations\)](#) have been identified
- Homelessness workgroup continues to collaborate on response



- First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19. [\(ODH Order\)](#)
- Limited access to jails & detention facilities continues
- ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across their statewide facilities

State EOC Actions by Emergency Support Function

1 | Transportation

- Ohio Department of Transportation

Actions Taken:

- ESF1 will be distributing PPE to 88 counties on Monday November 2.

Planned Actions:

- ODOT continues to work with law enforcement to prepare for any unexpected highway situations (protesting, rioting etc) as a result of the outcome of elections for Tuesday November 3.

Planned Actions:

- Support County EOCs and continue working with state agency partners as necessary (via deployment or virtual means).

8 | Public Health

- Ohio Department of Health

Actions Taken:

- During this operational period the ESF-8 desk has not initiated any mission requests with State partners.

Planned Actions:

- Continues to collaborate on planning efforts and provide guidance and information to various ESF-8 partners and stakeholders.

13 | Law Enforcement

- Ohio State Highway Patrol

Actions Taken:

- Provided site security for the Ohio Department of Health.

Planned Actions:

- Provide site security for the Ohio Department of Health.
- Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction

Actions Taken:

- Continued to work towards incident objectives.

Planned Actions:

- Has 1,532 staff COVID-19 positive, 1,318 staff recovered, 209 active positives and 5 deaths.
- Has 263 incarcerated adults COVID-19 active positive, 5,343 recovered and 103 deaths, 38,414 total tested Ohio National Guard, 100 soldiers activated for security missions at Richland Correctional Institution, Chillicothe Correctional Institution, Correction Reception Center, Lebanon Correctional Institution and Warren Correctional Institution.
- Plans to demobilize the soldiers at Richland Correctional Institution and utilize them at another location.

14 | Recovery

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency
The FEMA Public Assistance Program has been declared for COVID-19. There are currently 771 applicants and 177 active projects under the program.

Actions Taken:

- ESF-14 participated in the County Partners COVID-19 Call.

Planned Actions:

- ESF-14 will continue to provide assistance to partners and grant applicants.

Other Partners

- Ohio National Guard

Actions Taken:

- Continues to provide support to Ohio during the COVID-19 Pandemic with 13 active missions COVID-19 Sample Collection Support: 2 mission scheduled for today in Highland County and Defiance County Daily average of samples collected to date vs forecasted is 71%. No change from 19 October.
- 304 ONG personnel work in food banks around the State of Ohio.
- 2 specialists support the ODH Labs.
- 51 medical professionals are part of the sample collection teams.

November 2, 2020

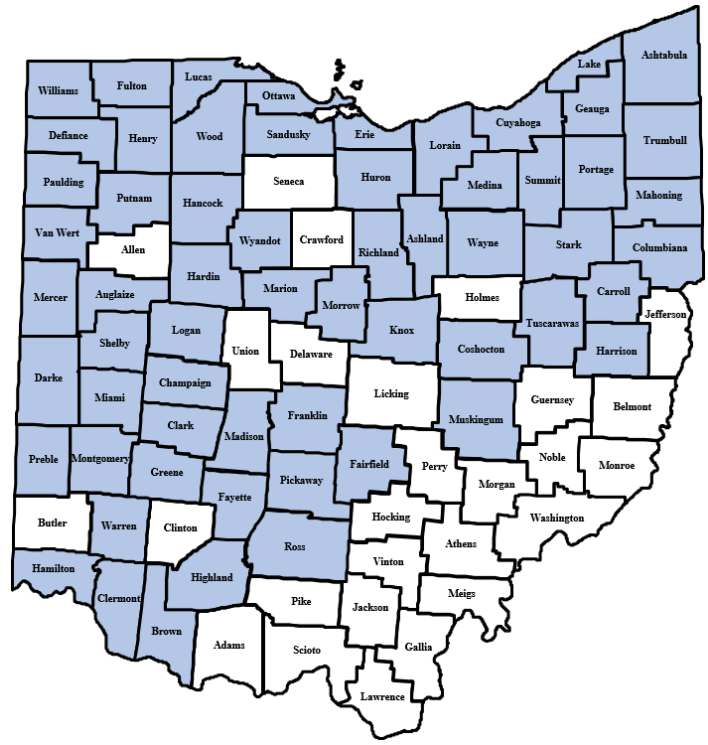
- 31 personnel provided COVID sample courier services on behalf of the Dept of Medicaid.
- 61 pax are working in the RSS warehouse moving PPE.

Planned Actions:

- COVID-19 Sample Collection Support Mission: 1 mission currently scheduled over the weekend for Sunday (01 November) in Hamilton County Specimen Courier.
- Transportation Support Mission: 15,014 specimens projected for pick up for tomorrow at 150 locations.

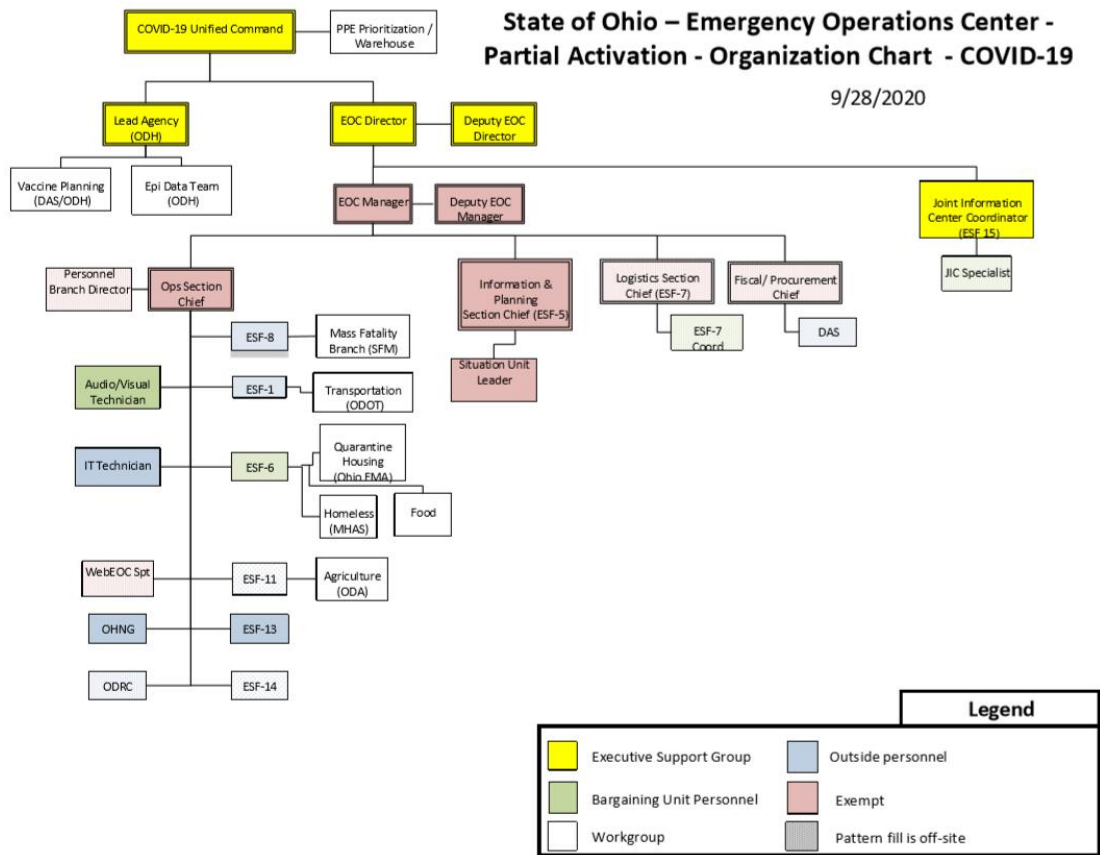
