Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 4,541 (250,268) total new cases, 8 (4,013) ICU admissions, 11 (5,517) deaths, and 102 (20,497) hospitalizations.

The State EOC is currently at Partial Activation as it continues to coordinate response to COVID-19. While the EOC is available for use by all Emergency Support Functions, ESFs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, and 15 will remain activated for the ongoing response.

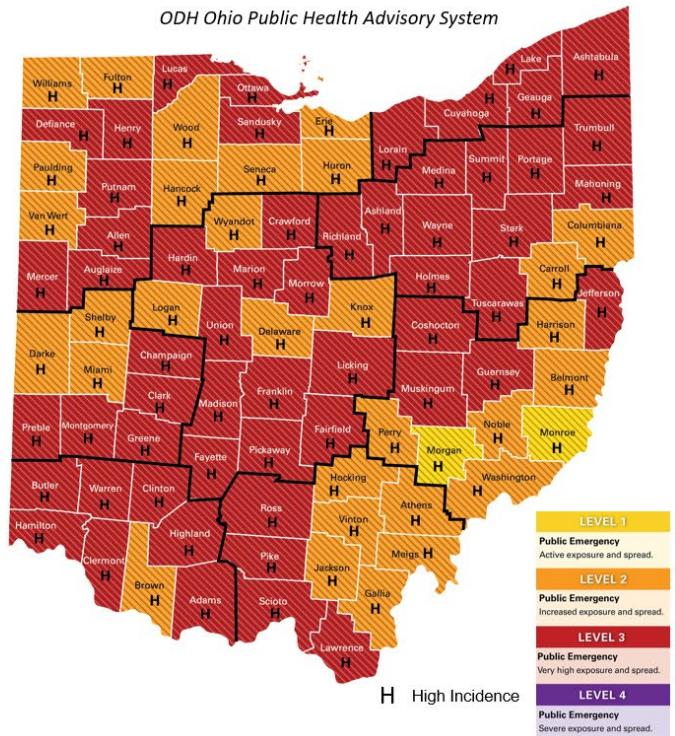

8 | Public Health

- Ohio Department of Health
 - The United States Government, as part of Operation Warp Speed, is preparing for the allocation of therapeutics. In anticipation of the likely issuance of emergency use authorizations (EUAs) for at least two monoclonal antibody therapeutic drugs developed to treat certain COVID-19 positive patients, Operation Warp Speed released an initial playbook to assist providers in planning.
 - Staffing in Zone 1 continues to be a concern among most healthcare systems in the zone as COVID+ cases continue to increase. Hospitals are looking at mitigation strategies to include increasing staffing ratios, temporarily suspending elective surgeries, or shutting down post-acute care units in order to increase available staffing.
 - Hospitalizations in Zone 2 continue to increase throughout the zone. Hospitals in zone 2 are expanding their COVID units but are experiencing consistent turnover in admissions and discharges, helping to maintain capacity.

Actions Taken:

- During this operational period the ESF-8 desk has not initiated any mission requests with State partners.
- Planning is completed for the 28th PPE Push of a total 197 pallets of containing a total push amount of 835,800 N95s, 1,632,000 gloves, and 2,566,000 surgical masks.
- Delivery will commence over the next week to 88 primary county drop sites.

Planned Actions:

- Continue to collaborate on planning efforts and provide guidance and information to various ESF-8 partners and stakeholders.
- ODH continues to participate in the ongoing vaccine planning efforts led by the Vaccine Planning Office.
- Mass Fatality working group meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, 10 Nov at 8:30a.m.

Actions Taken:

- Met with new ODH BHP manager to get acquainted and discuss opportunities for communication and collaboration related to the impact of the pandemic in the long-term care sector.
- Participated in Bridge Team calls to discuss staffing support needs for two long-term care facilities.

- Maintain situational awareness to provide support as needed.

- Ohio National Guard, 100 soldiers activated for security missions at Chillicothe Correctional Institution, Correction Reception Center, Grafton Correctional Institution Lebanon Correctional Institution and Warren Correctional Institution.
- Has a Special Operations team assisting Grafton Correctional Institution with Symptom Screenings.

Actions Taken:

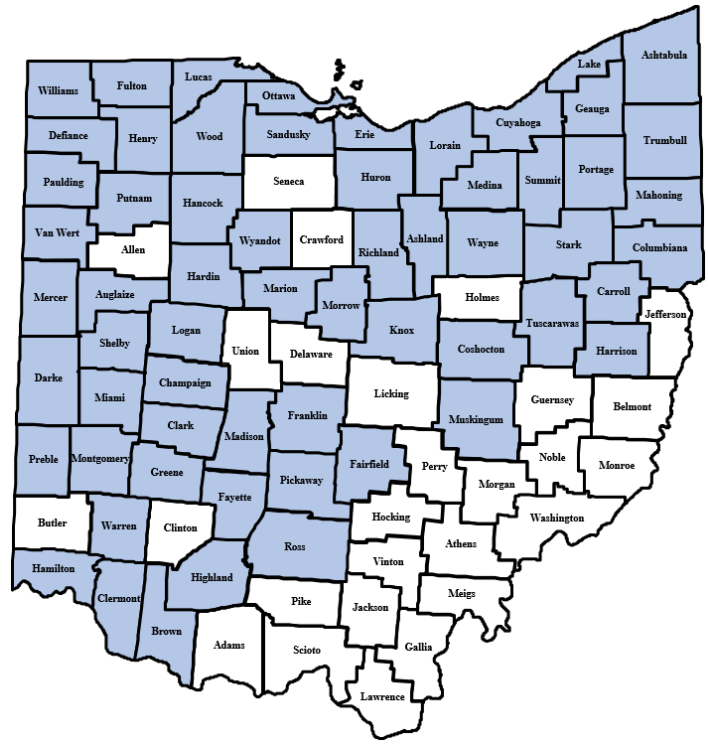
- Ohio National Guard continues to provide support to Ohio during the COVID-19 Pandemic with 11 active missions COVID-19 Sample Collection Support: 1 mission scheduled for today in Madison County.
- Daily average of samples collected to date vs forecasted is 71%. No change from 19 October.
- 296 ONG personnel work in food banks around the State of Ohio.
- 2 specialists support the ODH Labs.
- 58 medical professionals are part of the sample collection teams.
- 67 personnel provided COVID sample courier services on behalf of the Dept of Medicaid.
- 53 pax are working in the RSS warehouse moving PPE.

Planned Actions:

- COVID-19 Sample Collection Support Mission: 2 missions currently scheduled in Lawrence and Franklin Counties Specimen Courier Transportation Support Mission 14,114 specimens projected for pick up for tomorrow at 149 locations.

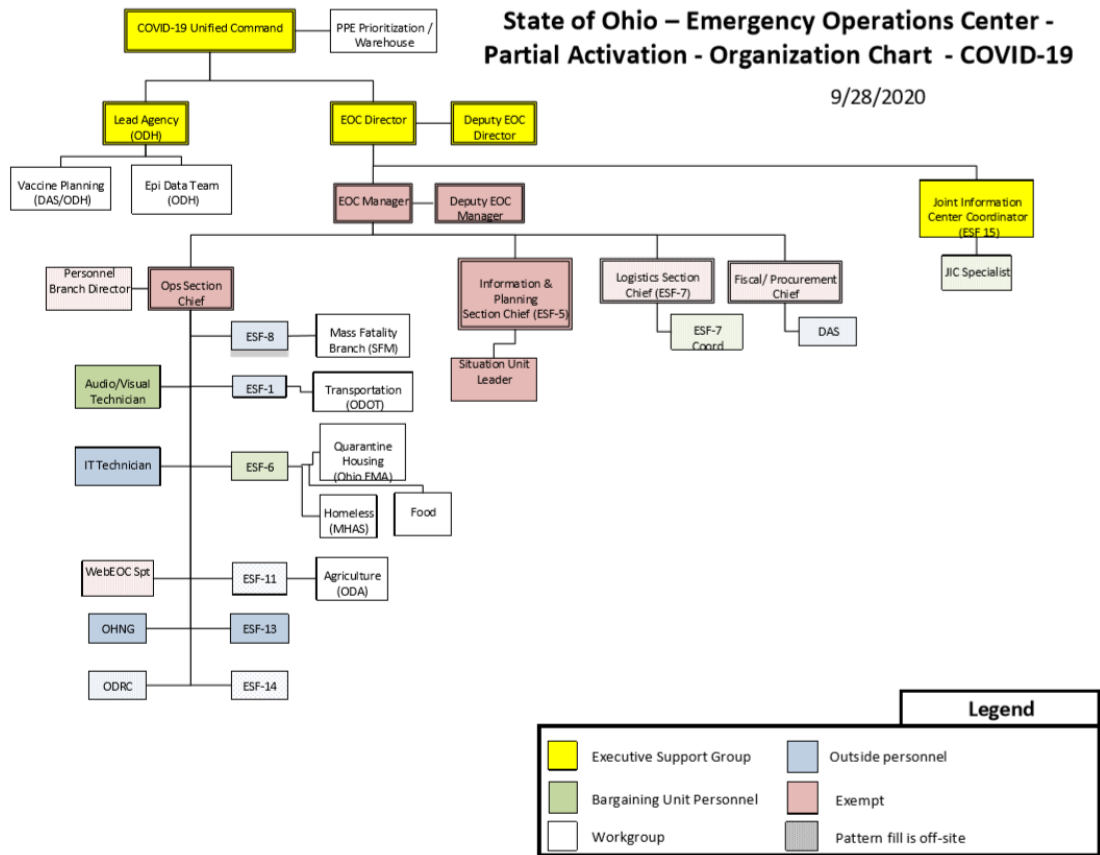
