Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 6,508 (261,482) total new cases, 39 (4,086) ICU admissions, 23 (5,547) deaths, and 386 (21,037) hospitalizations.

The State EOC is currently at Partial Activation as it continues to coordinate response to COVID-19. While the EOC is available for use by all Emergency Support Functions, ESFs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, and 15 will remain activated for the ongoing response.



Ohio Department of Aging / LTC Ombudsman

Actions Taken:

- State Ombudsman responded to long-term care provider looking for facilities accepting COVID-19 positive residents, sent a request for information to regional Ombudsman representatives, and connected provider to the Zone 1 lead.
- Aging provided updates to Area Agencies on Aging regarding resource support.
- Ombudsman representatives continued to respond to questions and complaints regarding isolation and care of long-term care consumers.

- ODRC has 199 incarcerated adults COVID-19 active positive, 5,563 recovered and 104 deaths, 40,374 total tested.
- Ohio National Guard, 100 soldiers activated for security missions at Chillicothe Correctional Institution, Correction Reception Center, Grafton Correctional Institution Lebanon Correctional Institution and Warren Correctional Institution.
- o ODRC requested 50 additional ONG, they are being trained on 11-11-20.

14 | Recovery

Ohio Emergency Management Agency

The FEMA Public Assistance Program has been declared for COVID-19. There are currently 772 applicants and 189 active projects under the program.

Actions Taken:

ESF-14 participated in the County Partners COVID-19 Call.

Planned Actions:

ESF-14 will continue to provide assistance to partners and grant applicants.

Other Partners

Ohio National Guard

Actions Taken:

- o 296 ONG personnel work in food banks around the State of Ohio.
- 2 specialists support the ODH Labs.
- 39 medical professionals are part of the sample collection teams.
- 70 personnel provided COVID sample courier services on behalf of the Dept of Medicaid.
- 50 pax are working in the RSS warehouse moving PPE.
- Ohio National Guard continues to provide support to Ohio during the COVID-19
 Pandemic with 14 active missions.
- COVID-19 Sample Collection Support: 3 missions scheduled for Nov 10 in Montgomery, Portage, and Union Counties.
- Daily average of samples collected to date vs forecasted is 71%. No change from 19
 October.

Planned Actions:

- COVID-19 Sample Collection Support Mission: 1 mission currently scheduled for tomorrow in Washington County.
- Specimen Courier Transportation Support Mission 6,322 specimens projected for pick up for tomorrow at 58 locations.


