Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 7,101 (274,457) total new cases, 21 (4,143) ICU admissions, 35 (5,658) deaths, and 268 (21,558) hospitalizations.

The State EOC is currently at Partial Activation as it continues to coordinate response to COVID-19. While the EOC is available for use by all Emergency Support Functions, ESFs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, and 15 will remain activated for the ongoing response.

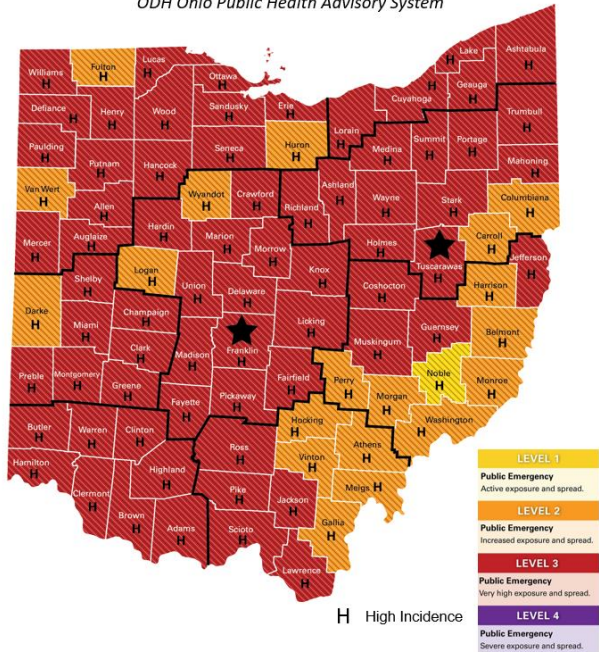

WebEOC Incident: 00 – OEMA – 20200128 - COVID -19

Actions Taken:

- Continued to work towards incident objectives.

Planned Actions:

- Has 1,842 staff COVID-19 positive, 1,489 staff recovered, 348 active positives and 5 deaths.
- Has 229 incarcerated adults COVID-19 active positive, 5,563 recovered and 104 deaths, 40,884 total tested.
- Ohio National Guard, 150 soldiers activated for security missions at Allen Correctional Institution, Chillicothe Correctional Institution, Correction Reception Center, Grafton Correctional Institution Lebanon Correctional Institution, London Correctional Institution and Warren Correctional Institution.

14 | Recovery

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency

The FEMA Public Assistance Program has been declared for COVID-19. There are currently 772 applicants and 189 active projects under the program.

15 Public Affairs

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency

- Gov. DeWine addressed Ohioans last night (Nov 11), calling on citizens to recommit their efforts to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Announced two forthcoming orders: Revised Mask Order and New Social Gathering Order. All orders are available on the ODH Coronavirus website.
- COVID-19 Pop-Up Testing today (Nov 12) in Columbus and Youngstown.
- COVID-19 Pop-Up Testing Friday, Nov 13, in London (Madison Co) and Oak Harbor (Ottawa Co); Saturday, Nov 14 in Columbus, Euclid (Cuyahoga Co) and Grove City (Franklin Co).
- Notes from Governor and Lt. Governor's November 12, 2 pm Briefing:
 - Ohio Dept. of Health reported **7,101** new COVID-19 cases today. Again, this is another all-time high. 34 COVID-related deaths reported.
 - There are 268 current COVID-19 hospitalizations in Ohio; and 21 COVID patients in ICU.

- Ohio's updated Advisory System Map now shows 68 Level 3 (Red) counties, another all-time high of red counties since the alert system was created. Noble County is the only county at Level 1 (Yellow).
- Franklin and Tuscarawas counties are on Ohio's watch list. Both have reached six out of seven indicators and are approaching Level 4 (Purple).
- The Governor announced two new dashboards that will be available on the ODH Coronavirus website:
 - Zip Code Dashboard – Users can view data from their local communities on a map and filter by probable or confirmed cases status, by county, a specific zip code, or a specified time period.
 - Flu Dashboard – The Ohio Dept. of Health provides this dash board every year. It shows flu trends over-time, with charts that indicate whether flu hospitalizations or cases of flu-like illness are on the rise or decline. Dashboard is available at www.flu.ohio.gov.
- Ohio is setting aside \$30 million to assist the 113 local health departments. Each department will receive \$200,000 to use in fighting COVID-19. The remaining money will be used to hire contact tracers to support local health department.
- Lt. Gov. Husted noted that the Small Business Relief Grant is still open. \$125 million is available to provide \$10,000 grants to help with rent payments, salaries, utility payments, and other costs.

Other Partners

- Ohio National Guard

Actions Taken:

- Continues to provide support to Ohio during the COVID-19 Pandemic with 15 active missions COVID-19 Sample Collection Support: 3 missions scheduled for today in Mahoning, Seneca and Franklin Counties Daily average of samples collected to date vs forecasted is 71%. No change from 19 October.
- 288 ONG personnel work in food banks around the State of Ohio.
- 2 specialists support the ODH Labs.
- 42 medical professionals are part of the sample collection teams.
- 67 personnel provided COVID sample courier services on behalf of the Dept of Medicaid.
- 50 pax are working in the RSS warehouse moving PPE.

Planned Actions:

- COVID-19 Sample Collection Support Mission: 2 mission currently scheduled for tomorrow in Madison and Ottawa counties.

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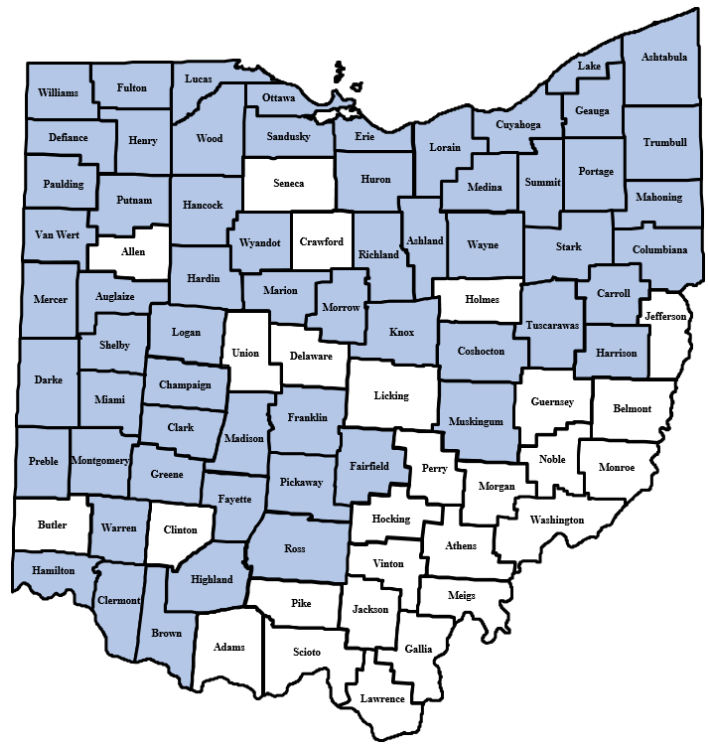
- Specimen Courier Transportation Support Mission 6,453 specimens projected for pick up for tomorrow at 65 locations.

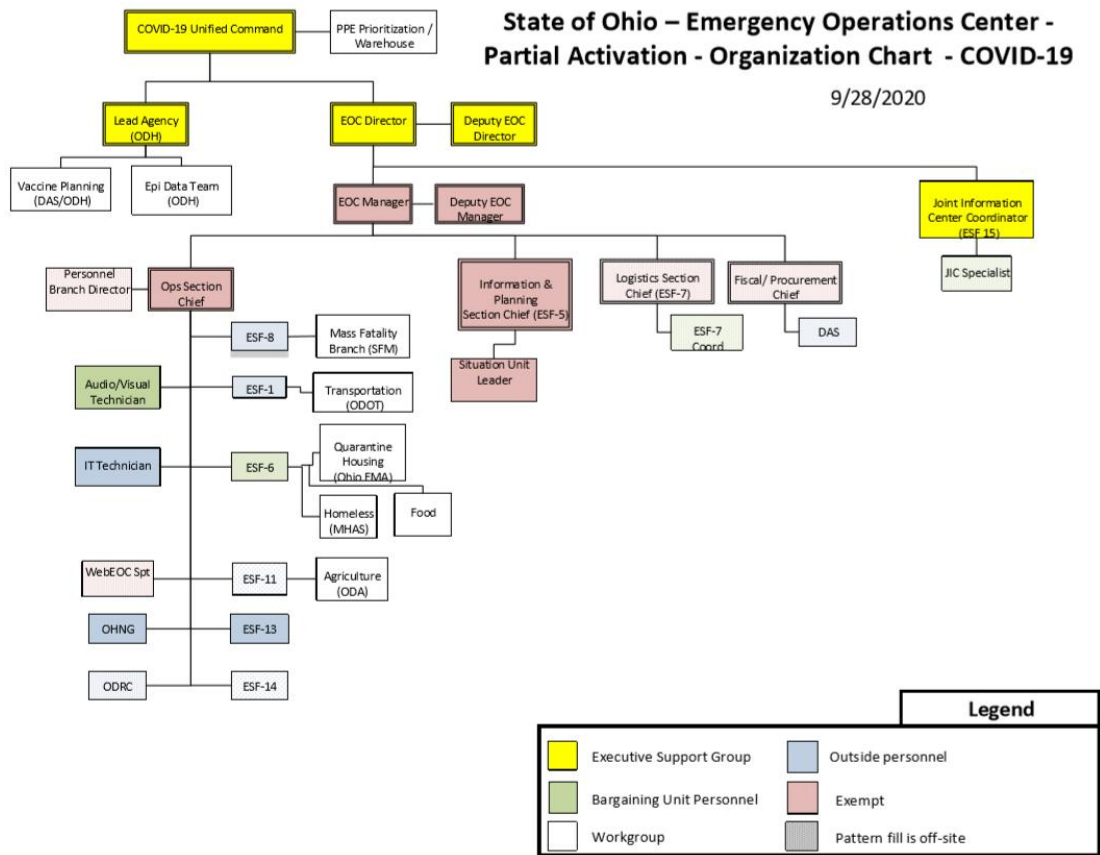
