Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 8,604 (371,908) total new cases, 29 (4,483) ICU admissions, 98 (6,118) deaths, and 364 (25,069) hospitalizations.

The State EOC is currently at Partial Activation as it continues to coordinate response to COVID-19. While the EOC is available for use by all Emergency Support Functions, ESFs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, and 15 will remain activated for the ongoing response.



Actions Taken:

- Contacted local EMA director 11/23/2020 and 11/24/2020 to discuss the current issues on homelessness facing Clark County and how Ohio EMA/state of Ohio can assist in these efforts
- Worked with ESF-6 partners to coordinate current state level partner efforts on how they are addressing the homelessness issues in Clark County
- ESF-6 has worked to identify the various agencies currently supporting efforts in Clark County while trying to further identify additional means of support (integration of more state partners, situational awareness of current/planning efforts)
- Currently working to identify a subject matter expert (likely COHIIO and Ohio Development Services Agency) to assist with the homelessness issue and interface with Clark County Partners (Interfaith Hospitality Network and Springfield City Development)

8 | Public Health

Ohio Department of Health

Actions Taken:

- Adelaide Warehouse in conjunction with our ESF-1 partners are completing the 30th PPE Push of 50 pallets to three (3) primary county drop sites tomorrow. This is Day 2 of a 2 Day distribution containing a total push amount of 344,800 eaches of nonmedical gowns.
- Zone 2. As hospitalizations continue to increase in Zone 2, health systems continue to conduct lateral transfers to balance patient loads, work through surge staffing plans, and develop plans for postponing elective procedures.
- Zone 3. Zone 3 hospital leaders conducted a call with ODH and the Governor's office to discuss the current surge hospitals are experiencing.
- Staffing shortage remains the largest concern for hospitals, especially for specialty areas, ECMO and continuous renal replacement therapy (CRRT).

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- The Southwest Region is unable to use all of the ECMO machines in the SW region due to lack of staff.
- During this operational period the ESF-8 desk has initiated one mission request with State partners.

Planned Actions:

- ODH continues to collaborate on planning efforts and provide guidance and information to various ESF-8 partners and stakeholders.
- Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction

Actions Taken:

Continued to work towards incident objectives.

Planned Actions:

- ODRC has 476 active positives staff COVID-19 and 5 deaths for staff members.
- ODRC has 429incarcerated adults COVID-19 active positives and 109 deaths.
- Ohio National Guard, 150 soldiers activated for security missions at Allen Correctional Institution, Correction Reception Center, Lebanon Correctional Institution, London Correctional Institution Southeastern Correctional Institution and Warren Correctional Institution. ODRC has requested 50 additional soldiers for security assistance to be trained today November 24, 2020.
- Special Operations has a team supporting Marion Correctional Institution and Southeastern with symptom checks.
- The Ohio State Highway Patrol is performing security assistance at Southeastern Correctional Institution.

Actions Taken:

- COVID-19 Pop-Up Testing today (Nov 24) was cancelled in Cleveland. Pop-Up testing in Marysville and Crooksville.
- COVID-19 Pop-Up Testing Saturday, Nov 28 in Perrysburg (Wood Co).
- Notes from Governor and Lt. Governor's November 19, 2 pm Briefing:

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- Gov. DeWine announced that Ohio should receive its first batch of COVID-19 vaccine around December 15, 2020.
- Other Good News: October unemployment is down to 5.6%;
 Regional representatives are reporting that they are observing 90% mask-wearing compliance.
- School Sports If schools are continuing with sports, they are asked to hold events without fans, not even parents.
- Ohio's data shows 8,604 new COVID cases for Nov. 24. Yesterday's numbers were inflated (11,885 positive cases) due to technical problems with two labs being unable to report cases for two days.
- ODH reports 98 COVID-related deaths over the last 24 hours, bringing total Ohio deaths reported to 6,118.
- ODH reports 364 patients were hospitalized over the last 24 hours with COVID-19.
- Lt. Gov. Husted reports 195,282 jobs are available on OhioMeansJobs.com. More than 94,000 of those jobs listed pay \$50,000(+) annual salary. There are also 2,900 internships available.
- Lt. Gov. Husted announced the Ohio Council of Retail Merchants launched the "Buy in Ohio" campaign, to encourage Ohio shoppers to support businesses within the state.
- Gov. DeWine noted that the US. Travel Advisory Map will post tomorrow, instead of Thanksgiving Thursday. Ohio has a near 14% COVID positivity rate, nearing the 15% advising travelers not to travel here.
- The governor had four guests on: A respiratory therapist who was diagnosed with coronavirus and hospitalized with serious complications; A lady who was exposed to COVID and unintentionally brought it home to her family her husband was transported to Univ. of Cincinnati and is in intensive care; a doctor with Trinity Health System in Steubenville who spoke of COVID case spikes; and a nurse at Miami Valley Hospital working at an all-COVID intensive care unit. She said "This third wave seems to be more intense than back in March and April."

Continued to work towards incident objectives.

- o 295 ONG personnel work in food banks around the State of Ohio.
- Support to Objective 2: Provide mission support to identify, prevent, mitigate, and respond to COVID-19 hot spots.

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- 2 specialists support the ODH Labs.
- o 89 medical professionals are part of the sample collection teams.
- 42 personnel provided COVID sample courier services on behalf of the Dept of Medicaid.
- o Support to Objective 4: Finalize warehousing strategy and execute weekly PPE push.
- 50 pax are working in the RSS warehouse moving PPE.
- Ohio National Guard continues to provide support to Ohio during the COVID-19
 Pandemic with 11 active missions.
- COVID-19 Sample Collection Support: 2 missions scheduled for today in Union and Perry Counties.
- Daily average of samples collected to date vs forecasted is 71%. No change from 19
 October.

Planned Actions:

- COVID-19 Sample Collection Support Mission: 0 missions currently scheduled for November 25.
- Specimen Courier Transportation Support Mission: 10,422 projected specimens for pick up tomorrow in 109 locations.


