Executive Summary

AS of November 25, the Ohio Department of Health reported 10,835 (382,743) total new cases, 44 (4,527) ICU admissions, 156 (6,274) deaths, and 417 (25,486) hospitalizations.

The State EOC is currently at Partial Activation as it continues to coordinate response to COVID-19. While the EOC is available for use by all Emergency Support Functions, ESFs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, and 15 will remain activated for the ongoing response.

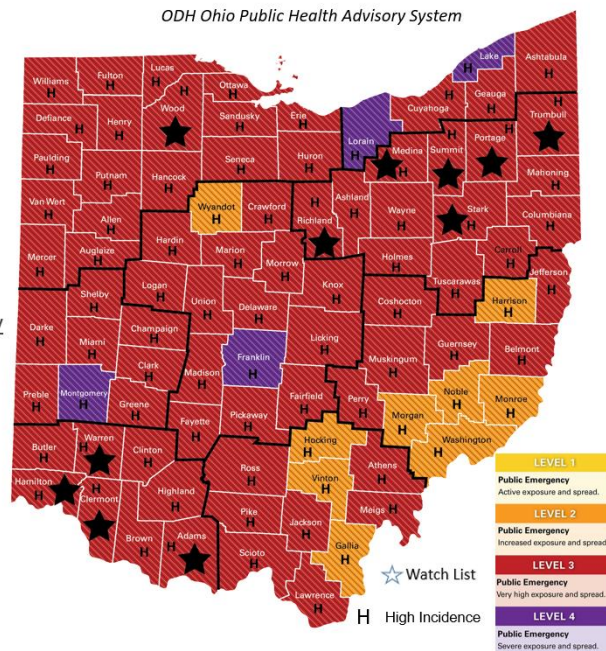

8 | Public Health

- Ohio Department of Health

Actions Taken:

- Zone 1 - Lucas County EMA has requested 20 Trilogy EV300 Ventilators on behalf of ProMedica Health System for care of ICU/critical patients in ProMedica's Ohio hospitals.
- Zone 3- Dayton Children's will soon start to accept adult patients (up to age 35) transferred from adult hospitals with certain diagnoses that fit within the scope of what Dayton Children's staff can treat. Dayton Children's will not be treating adults with a primary COVID-19 diagnosis.
- ODH continues to participate in rigorous and ongoing vaccine planning efforts led by the Vaccine Planning Office.
- Additional surge capacity guidance went out to all funeral homes via Ohio Funeral Directors' Association.
- As part of Operation Warp Speed – Ohio received two therapeutics this week to treat non-hospitalized patients with COVID-19. This included 2,330 doses of the Eli Lilly drug (Bamlanivimab) and 1,680 doses of the Regeneron drug (Casirivimab and Imdevimab Antibody Cocktail). Hospital and healthcare system allocations were sent to AmerisourceBergen yesterday. The Emergency Use Authorizations for both drugs are extremely similar with the Eli Lilly product being cleared November 9th and the Regeneron drug receiving FDA approval November 21st.
- Mass Fatality continues to work with all partners to maintain real time situational awareness on local/regional morgue surge capacity and is prepared to deploy additional surge capacity resources if necessary.

- 31st and 32nd PPE Pushes for next week are assigned to ESF-1 for distribution to 88 county drop sites.

- 50 pax are working in the RSS warehouse moving PPE.
- Ohio National Guard continues to provide support to Ohio during the COVID-19 Pandemic with 11 active missions.
- COVID-19 Sample Collection Support: 0 missions scheduled for November 25.
- Daily average of samples collected to date vs forecasted is 71%. No change from 19 October.

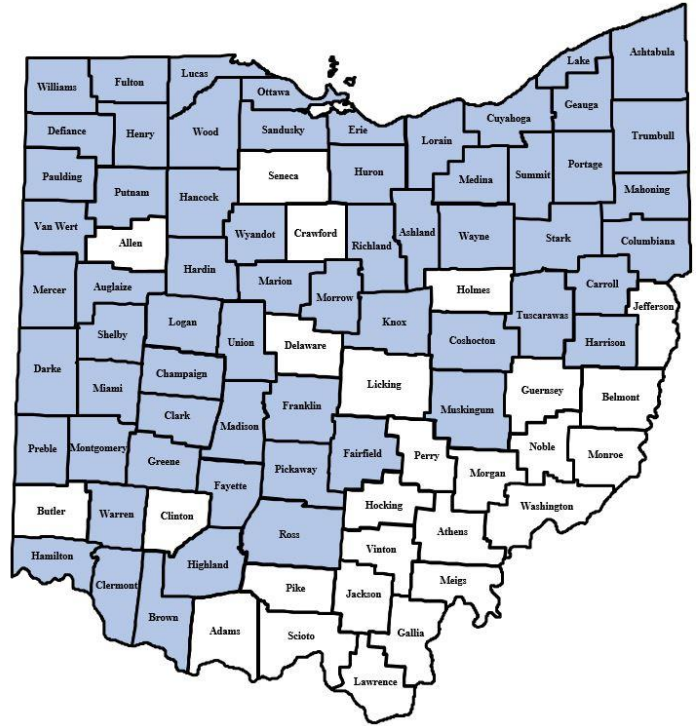

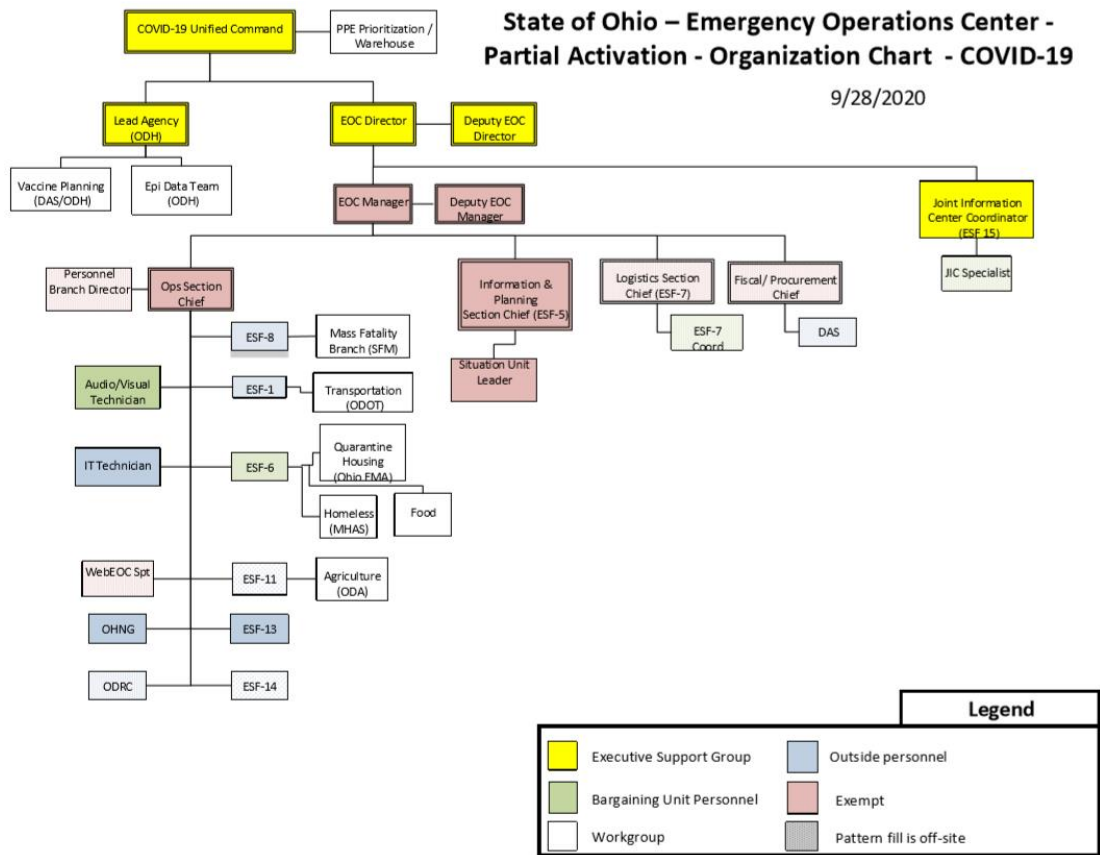
