Executive Summary

In the last 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 7,729 (414,432) total new cases, 36 (4,644) ICU admissions, 21 (6,399) deaths, and 245 (26,507) hospitalizations.

The State EOC is currently at Partial Activation as it continues to coordinate response to COVID-19. While the EOC is available for use by all Emergency Support Functions, ESFs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, and 15 will remain activated for the ongoing response.

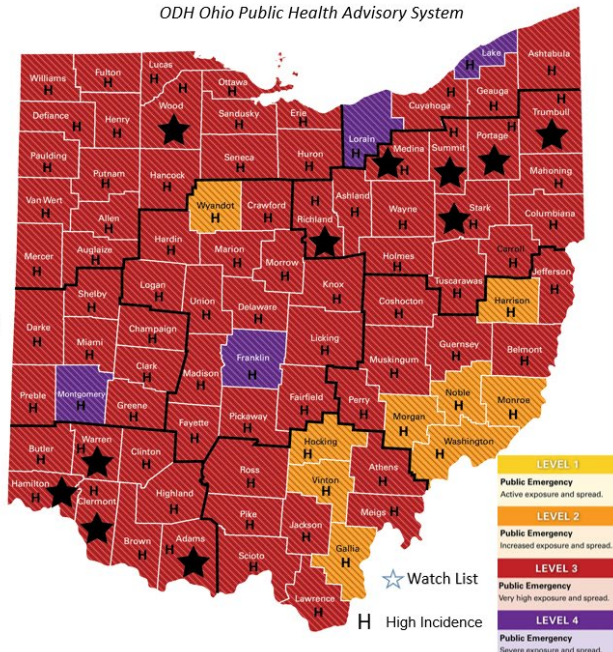

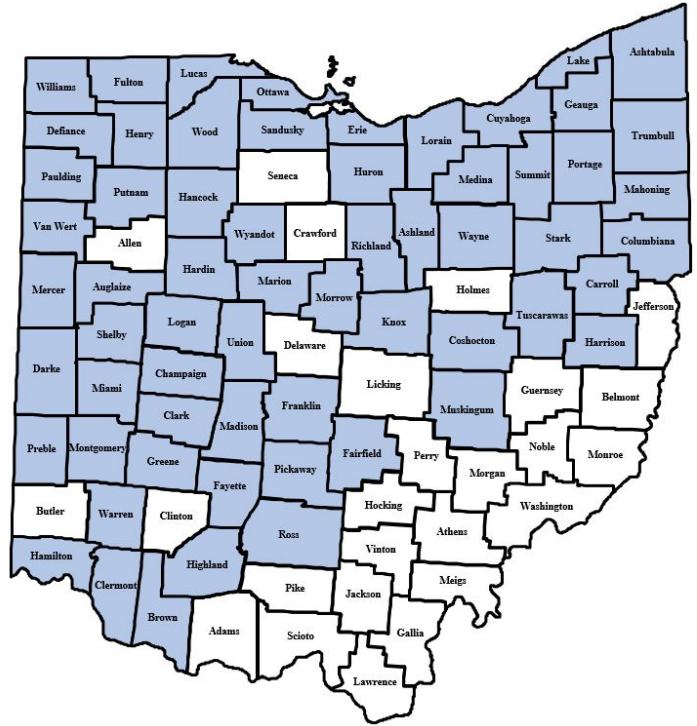
- ODRC has 668 active positives staff COVID-19 and 5 deaths for staff members.

- Ohio National Guard, 200 soldiers activated for security missions at Allen Correctional Institution, Correction Reception Center, Lebanon Correctional Institution, London Correctional Institution, Lorain Correctional Institution, Southeastern Correctional Institution, Toledo Correctional Institution and Warren Correctional Institution.
- ODRC has requested 100 additional soldiers for security assistance to be trained December 1, and December 2, 2020.

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- Special Operations has a team supporting Marion Correctional Institution, Southeastern with symptom checks and Toledo Correctional Institution with security assistance.
- Ohio State Highway Patrol is assisting ODRC with perimeter assistance at Southeastern Correctional Institution and Toledo Correctional Institution.

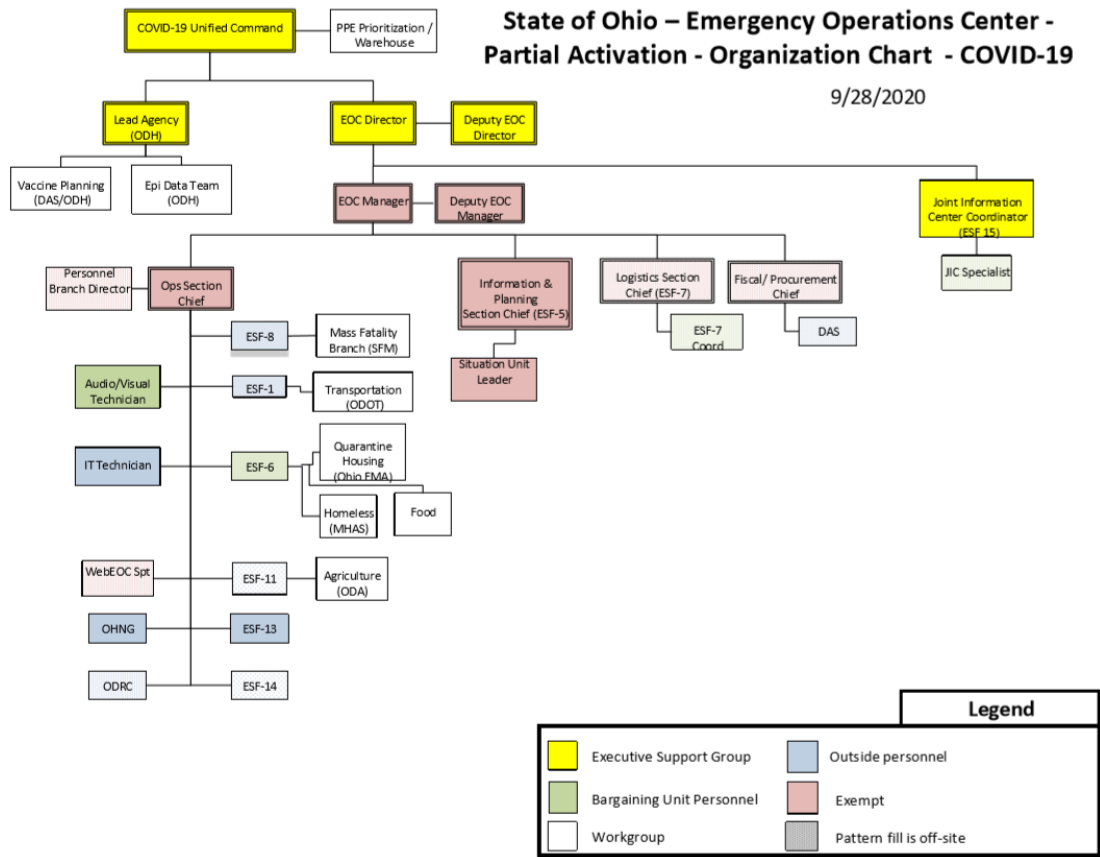
