Executive Summary

In the last 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 8,377 (622,806) total new cases, 17 (5,550) ICU admissions, 16 (8,047) deaths, and 194 (34,747) hospitalizations.

The State EOC is currently at Partial Activation as it continues to coordinate response to COVID-19. While the EOC is available for use by all Emergency Support Functions, ESFs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, and 15 will remain activated for the ongoing response.

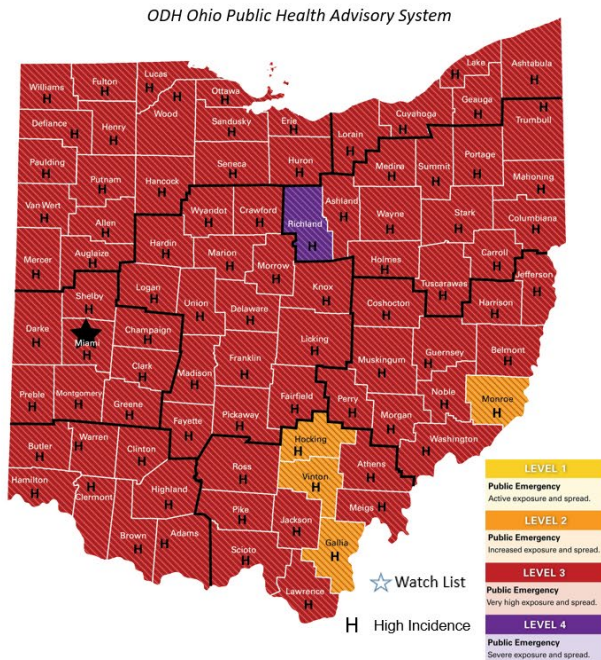

Primary Lifeline



- ODH reports an increase of key metrics (cases, hospitalizations, deaths)
- Three active RRF remain in-progress; 14 addressed and are no longer active
 - OHNG Title 32 support is scheduled to cease on March 31, 2021
 - Eight million nitrile gloves have been requested
 - Battelle CCDS funding is approved through March 31, 2021
- Medical Care: OHA reports multiple hospitals nearing capacity
- Public Health:
 - COVID-19 Vaccine is being distributed to front-line healthcare providers
 - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting sample collection and ODH labs
- Medical Supply Chain: Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting the RSS and Adelaide Warehouses
- Fatality Management: ODH assets are deployed and pre-staged to support County EMA needs



- Food: Title 32 OHNG personnel are providing support to Ohio-based food banks
- Shelter: Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues
 - [\(Potential quarantine locations\)](#) have been identified
 - Homelessness workgroup continues to collaborate on response



- Law Enforcement/Safety:
 - ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across statewide facilities
 - State Active Duty OHNG members are providing staffing support to select ODRC facilities
 - ESF-13 is providing site security at select ODRC facilities and county jails
 - First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19. [\(ODH Order\)](#)

Public Health (Primary Lifeline)

- Medical Care (ESF-8):
 - Zone 1- Several hospitals throughout the zone are reporting a little more availability capacity in bed space due to recent increase in hospital discharges.
 - The COVID-19 vaccine continues to be administered at hospital's across the zone with overwhelming support from staff. No significant concerns regarding future rollout as the volume of drugs available increases over the next few weeks.
 - Ventilator Status As of Dec 18 - No change.
 - The State of Ohio/ODH has filled four (4) hospital requests for 32 ventilator kits total.
 - There are no pending hospital requests for ventilator kits.
 - There are 648 State owned ventilator kits available. See attached Healthcare Resources Situation Report.

 - The first fifty (50) doses of Bamlanivimab was delivered to Ohio Pharmacy Services on Thursday, 17 December to begin infusions on COVID+ inmates.

 - Mass Fatality Branch received confirmation from partners at ODNR that they will be able to provide carpentry support to build storage racks in each mobile asset which would effectively triple the storage capacity of each unit.
 - Mass Fatality desk received a request from Lorain Co. for surge capacity resources. They have been advised that there are units staged in neighboring Cuyahoga County for their use.
 - As of 18 Dec, across the state the Mass Fatality Branch currently has:
 - 8 mobile assets pre-staged, (no change)
 - 5 units in process of pre-staging, (no change)
 - 9 mobile assets available (no change)
 - 1 pending request (Lorain Co. to use units staged in Cuyahoga)

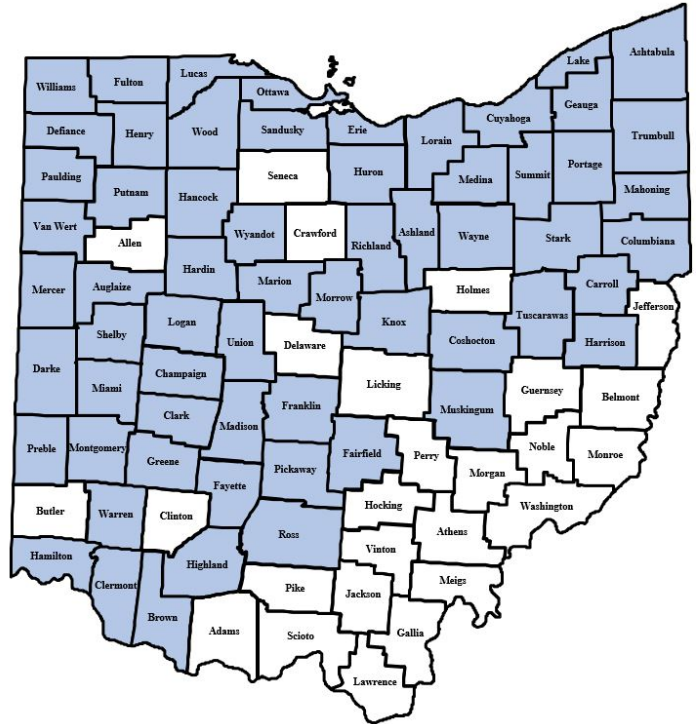
- Continues to work towards incident objectives.

- ODRC has 497 incarcerated adults COVID-19 active positives and 110 deaths.
- Ohio National Guard, 300 soldiers activated for security missions at Allen Correctional Institution, Correction Reception Center, Dayton Correctional Institution, Franklin Medical Center, Lebanon Correctional Institution, Lorain Correctional Institution, Ohio State Penitentiary, and Toledo Correctional Institution. 62 soldiers activated at 15 institutions to assist with symptom screening missions.
- ODRC has activated 50 soldiers to the Cuyahoga County Corrections Center in Cleveland, Ohio.
- Ohio State Highway Patrol is assisting ODRC with perimeter assistance at Lebanon Correctional Institution, Lorain Correctional Institution, and Southern Ohio Correctional Institution.

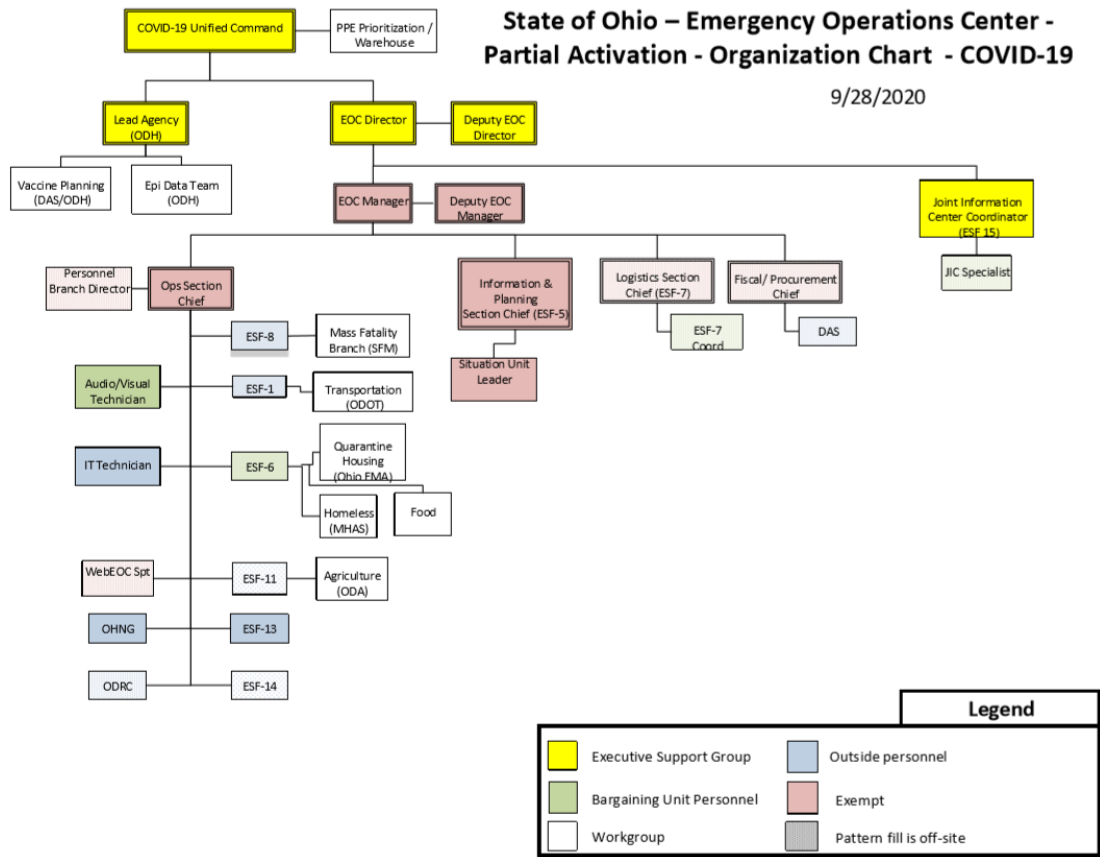
