Executive Summary

In the last 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 7,580 (735,003) total new cases, 44 (6,022) ICU admissions, 104 (9,247) deaths, and 538 (39,650) hospitalizations.

The next PPE push, which will consist of gloves and three-ply surgical masks is scheduled for January 11 and 13th, 2021.

The State EOC is currently at Partial Activation as it continues to coordinate response to COVID-19. While the EOC is available for use by all Emergency Support Functions, ESFs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, and 15 will remain activated for the ongoing response.








State Community Lifeline Status

In-state Response | Ongoing External Support | Assistance Needed

- ODH reports an increase of key metrics (cases, hospitalizations, deaths)
- Three active RRF remain in-progress; 14 addressed and are no longer active
 - OHNG Title 32 support is scheduled to cease on March 31, 2021 with a last day of operational support scheduled for March 17, 2021.
 - Eight million nitrile gloves have been requested
 - Battelle CCDS funding is approved through February 28, 2021
- Medical Care:
 - OHA reports multiple hospitals nearing capacity
 - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supplementing Long-Term Care facility staffing as needed
- Public Health:
 - Available COVID-19 vaccinations are being administered per the state's Vaccination Program
 - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting sample collection and ODH labs
- Medical Supply Chain: Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting the RSS and Adelaide Warehouses
- Fatality Management: ODH assets are deployed and pre-staged to support County EMA needs
- Food: Title 32 OHNG personnel are providing support to Ohio-based food banks
- Shelter: Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues
 - (Potential quarantine locations) have been identified
 - Homelessness workgroup continues to collaborate on response
- Law Enforcement/Safety:
 - ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across statewide facilities
 - State Acitve Duty OHNG members are providing staffing support to select ODRC facilities
 - ESF-13 is providing site security at select ODRC facilities, county jails and ODH facilities
 - First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19. (ODH Order)

- Medical Care (ESF-8):
 - Zone 1: Adult ICU capacity is an area of concern across the zone at 78% utilization.
 Region 5 (NECO) has the highest utilization rate in the zone at 85% of its capacity; over 22% of the patients in intensive care are due to COVID-19.
 - Zone 2: The Central Ohio Transport plan has been activated and hospitals are load balancing patients due to three or more hospitals with a high Emergency Department (ED) census. Adult ICU bed utilization is currently at 87% across the zone and 90% for the central region. Staffing remains a concern for Zone 2.
 - Zone 3: The use of Adult ICU bed continues to increase nearing 89% overall utilization. Strained staffing levels are being reported, 59% of hospitals in Southwest Region is anticipating shortages of nurse staffing. Southwest Region 6 reported that most residents are accepting the vaccine, there is still a moderate resistance among congregate care staff.

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- Ohio National Guard, 300 soldiers activated for security missions at Allen Correctional Institution, Correction Reception Center, Dayton Correctional Institution, Franklin Medical Center, Grafton Correctional Institution, Lebanon Correctional Institution, Lorain Correctional Institution, Ohio State Penitentiary, and Southern Ohio correctional Facility.
- 67 soldiers activated at 16 institutions to assist with symptom screening missions.
- ODRC has activated 50 soldiers to the Cuyahoga County Corrections Center in Cleveland, Ohio.
- Ohio State Highway Patrol is assisting ODRC with perimeter assistance at Lorain Correctional Institution, North Central Correctional Institution and Southern Ohio Correctional Institution- all three missions will be closed by the end of this week.

Joint Information Center

Actions Taken:

- Pop-Up Testing today in Marysville at the Union County Fairgrounds.
- Gov. DeWine and Lt. Gov. Husted held a COVID-19 Update press briefing (01/05):
 - Gov. DeWine noted: As of Sunday, January 3rd, 61% of residents in Ohio nursing homes have received their first COVID-19 vaccine shot

 those who wished to receive it. Only 40% of the staff have been taking the vaccine when offered.
 - Starting Friday, January 8th, many at nursing homes who have received their first dose will begin to receive their second dose. Those who chose not to get vaccinated during the first round can then get their first dose, if they decide.
 - Dept. of Aging Dir. Ursel McElroy discussed efforts to encourage nursing home residents and staff to get the vaccine to protect themselves, their families and their communities. The director acknowledged many may have hesitancies and concerns about the vaccine. Dept. of Aging is conducting informative virtual

- conferences and calls to address concerns and provide education about the vaccines.
- Gov. DeWine re-emphasized goals of phases 1A and 1B of Ohio's Vaccination Program. Noted vaccinations in group 1A will finish up in the next couple of weeks. Goals:
- Save lives and protect the most vulnerable
- Protect those who protect us in the healthcare field
- Get school children back in schools (in-person learning) by March 1
- Ohio COVID-19 numbers for January 5: ODH reports 7,580 new COVID cases. Total cases: 735,003. There were 104 COVID-related deaths reported. Total number of COVID-related deaths: 9,247.
 ODH reports 538 new hospitalizations, including 44 new ICU patients.
- Dr. Vanderhoff said that Ohio COVID-related hospitalizations have increased almost seven times since October 1, and three times the hospitalizations since November 1. Also discussed the new UK virus variant. This new variant appears more contagious, but doesn't appear to be more severe.
- Lt. Gov. Husted noted that Ohio will receive between 100,000 and 175,000 first doses of the COVID vaccine. The state is prioritizing who gets the vaccine first – mainly, those who could die without the vaccine.
- Lt. Gov. Husted announced the deadline to apply for the Ohio Bar & Restaurant Assistance Fund has been extended to January 31. More than 4,600 permit holders are eligible for this funding.


