

Executive Summary

In the last 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 6,088 (777,065) total new cases, 12 (6,160) ICU admissions, 28 (9,627) deaths, and 101 (41,158) hospitalizations.

The next PPE push, which will consist of gloves and three-ply surgical masks is scheduled for January 11 and 13th, 2021.

The State EOC is currently at Partial Activation as it continues to coordinate response to COVID-19. While the EOC is available for use by all Emergency Support Functions, ESFs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, and 15 will remain activated for the ongoing response.



State Community Lifeline Status

- Medical Care (ESF-8):
 - Zone 1. The zone has seen an overall decrease of about 30% in its COVID+ census since December 1st. Despite the positive trend the zone still remains at 78% utilization of its intensive care unit beds and hospitals remain cautious of another surge in cases. -Multiple hospitals are reporting an increase in caregivers out due to COVID-19 which continues to put a strain on its ability to treat COVID and non-COVID patients.
 - The State of Ohio/ODH has filled six (6) hospital requests for 41 ventilator kits total. There are no pending hospital requests for ventilator kits. There are 855 State owned ventilator kits available.

 - ODH has established 16 objectives for this operational period. The top five objectives, listed below, place an emphasis on Surveillance, Public Health Messaging, Vaccine Planning, Surge Deployment Services (Contact Tracing), and Laboratory Testing.
 - Conduct surveillance to identify individual cases and outbreaks.
 - Continue and update a comprehensive messaging strategy for the prevention of COVID-19.
 - Enhance the mass-vaccination strategy for COVID-19 and continue developing the distribution strategy.
 - Maintain Surge Deployment Services providing case interviews, contact interview and symptom monitoring, workflow analysis and improvement.
 - Provide laboratory testing and engage in statewide testing operations as warranted.

- ODRC has activated 50 soldiers to the Cuyahoga County Corrections Center in Cleveland, Ohio.




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State EOC Organization Chart (COVID-19-specific)
