Executive Summary

In the last 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 4,481 (864,322) total new cases, 14 (6,521) ICU admissions, 31 (10,711) deaths, and 98 (44,783) hospitalizations.

The State EOC is currently at Partial Activation as it continues to coordinate response to COVID-19. While the EOC is available for use by all Emergency Support Functions, ESFs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, and 15 will remain activated for the ongoing response.



State Community Lifeline Status

In-state Response | Ongoing External Support | Assistance Needed

- ODH reports an increase of key metrics (cases, hospitalizations, deaths)
- Three active RRF remain in-progress; 14 addressed and are no longer active
 - OHNG Title 32 support is scheduled to cease on March 31, 2021 with a last day of operational support scheduled for March 17, 2021.
 - Eight million nitrile gloves have been requested
 - Battelle CCDS funding is approved through February 28, 2021
- Medical Care:
 - OHA reports multiple hospitals nearing capacity
 - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supplementing Long-Term Care facility staffing as needed
- Public Health:
 - Available COVID-19 vaccinations are being administered per the state's Vaccination Program
 - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting sample collection and ODH labs
- Medical Supply Chain: Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting the RSS and Adelaide Warehouses
- Fatality Management: ODH assets are deployed and pre-staged to support County EMA needs

- Shelter: Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues (Potential quarantine locations) have been identified
 - Homelessness workgroup continues to collaborate on response

- Ohio National Guard, 263 soldiers activated for security missions at Franklin Medical Center, Grafton Correctional Institution, Lorain Correctional Institution, and Ohio State Penitentiary. 76 soldiers activated at 17 institutions to assist with symptom screening missions.
- ODRC has activated 30 soldiers to the Cuyahoga County Corrections Center in Cleveland, Ohio.

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- Ohio National Guard continues to provide support to Ohio during the COVID-19
 Pandemic with 13 active missions COVID-19 Sample Collection Support: One


