Executive Summary

In the last 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 5,247 (826,754) total new cases, 10 (6,355) ICU admissions, 65 (10,200) deaths, and 141 (43,189) hospitalizations.

The State EOC is currently at Partial Activation as it continues to coordinate response to COVID-19. While the EOC is available for use by all Emergency Support Functions, ESFs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, and 15 will remain activated for the ongoing response.

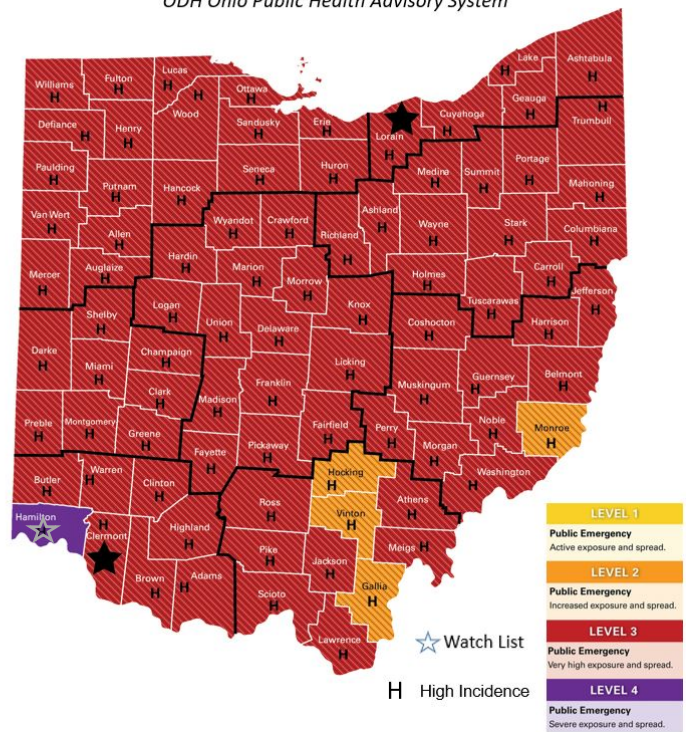

- ODH reports an increase of key metrics (cases, hospitalizations, deaths)
- Three active RRF remain in-progress; 14 addressed and are no longer active
 - OHNG Title 32 support is scheduled to cease on March 31, 2021 with a last day of operational support scheduled for March 17, 2021.
 - Eight million nitrile gloves have been requested
 - Battelle CCDS funding is approved through February 28, 2021
- Medical Care:
 - OHA reports multiple hospitals nearing capacity
 - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supplementing Long-Term Care facility staffing as needed
- Public Health:
 - Available COVID-19 vaccinations are being administered per the state's [Vaccination Program](#)
 - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting sample collection and ODH labs
- Medical Supply Chain: Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting the RSS and Adelaide Warehouses
- Fatality Management: ODH assets are deployed and pre-staged to support County EMA needs



- Food: Title 32 OHNG personnel are providing support to Ohio-based food banks
- Shelter: Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues
 - [\(Potential quarantine locations\)](#) have been identified
 - Homelessness workgroup continues to collaborate on response



- Law Enforcement/Safety:
 - ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across statewide facilities
 - State Active Duty OHNG members are providing staffing support to select ODRC facilities
 - ESF-13 is providing site security at select ODH facilities

 - Zone Updates:
 - Zone 1. Most hospitals throughout the zone are stabilizing or decreasing in the number of COVID patients that are in the ICU and staffing or out.
 - Various reports of strong collaborations between the hospitals and the local health departments working together to ensure vaccine efforts for 1A and 1B are underway.
 - Victory over COVID is a campaign in the NW region to mobilize energy around getting the vaccine and Governor Dewine was present on a call to support the local efforts.
 - Zone 2 and Zone 3- Nothing Significant to report.
 - Ventilator Updates: No change. The State of Ohio/ODH has filled Six (6) hospital requests for 41 ventilator kits total. There are no pending hospital requests for ventilator kits and there are 855 State owned ventilator kits available.
- Patient Movement (ESF-8, ESF-4):

- Public Health (ESF-8):
 - ODH has established 16 objectives for this operational period.
 - The top five objectives, listed below, place an emphasis on Surveillance, Public Health Messaging, Vaccine Planning, Surge Deployment Services (Contact Tracing), and Laboratory Testing.
 - Conduct surveillance to identify individual cases and outbreaks.
 - Continue and update a comprehensive messaging strategy for the prevention of COVID-19.
 - Enhance the mass-vaccination strategy for COVID-19 and continue developing the distribution strategy.
 - Maintain Surge Deployment Services - providing case interviews, contact interview and symptom monitoring, workflow analysis and improvement.
 - Provide laboratory testing and engage in statewide testing operations as warranted.
- Fatality Management (ESF-8):
 - Mass Fatality participated in County EMA Directors' call today to review/highlight MFM plan.
 - The Mass Fatality Branch currently has; (no changes).
 - 9 mobile assets pre-staged.

- Ohio National Guard, 263 soldiers activated for security missions at Allen Correctional Institution, Correction Reception Center, Dayton Correctional Institution, Franklin Medical Center, Grafton Correctional Institution, Lorain Correctional Institution, and Ohio State Penitentiary. 71 soldiers activated at 17 institutions to assist with symptom screening missions.
- ODRC has activated 40 soldiers to the Cuyahoga County Corrections Center in Cleveland, Ohio.

- Ohio National Guard continues to provide support to Ohio during the COVID-19 Pandemic with 12 active missions.
- 344 ONG personnel work in 14 food banks around the State of Ohio.
- 2 specialists support the ODH Labs. 108 medical professionals are part of the sample collection teams. 46 personnel provided COVID sample courier services on behalf of the Dept of Medicaid.
- 24 pax are working in the RSS warehouse moving PPE.

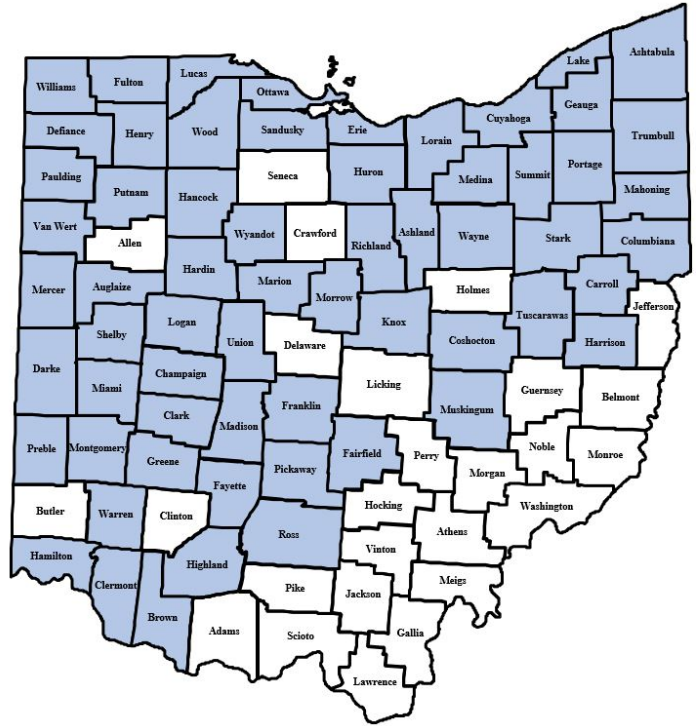

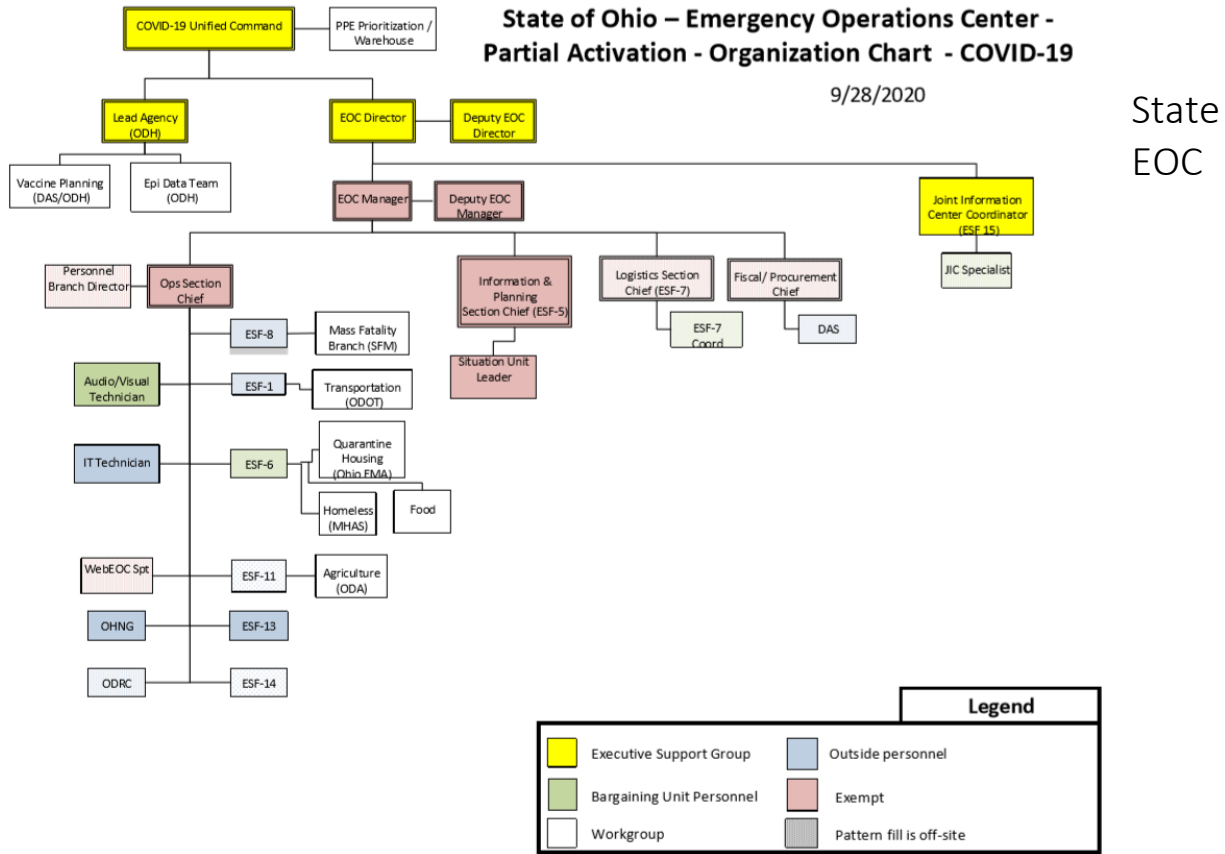
