Executive Summary

In the last 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 5,432 (883,716) total new cases, 23 (6,644) ICU admissions, 75 (11,006) deaths, and 256 (45,786) hospitalizations.

The State EOC is currently at Partial Activation as it continues to coordinate response to COVID-19. While the EOC is available for use by all Emergency Support Functions, ESFs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, and 15 will remain activated for the ongoing response.



State Community Lifeline Status

In-state Response | Ongoing External Support | Assistance Needed

- ODH reports a continued decline in reported cases since late December
- Three active RRF remain in-progress; 14 addressed and are no longer active
 - OHNG Title 32 support has been extended into September, 2021.
 - Eight million nitrile gloves have been requested
 - Battelle CCDS funding is approved through February 28, 2021
- Medical Care:
 - Emergency Department visits are on the decline since late December
 - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supplementing Long-Term Care facility staffing as needed
 - Public Health:
 - Ohio is working through pahse 1b of its <u>Vaccination Program</u>
 - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting sample collection and ODH labs
 - Medical Supply Chain: Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting the RSS and Adelaide Warehouses
 - Fatality Management: ODH assets are deployed and pre-staged to support County EMA needs

 - o Zone Updates:
 - Zone 1 The number of COVID-19 patients on ventilators in the zone had decreased approximately 30% over the last 2 weeks from 293 to 198. The NW Region, which has the largest number of state deployed ventilators, has also seen a similar decrease in utilization.
 - Zone 2 COVID-positive patient counts, remain stable throughout Zone 2. COVID-19 patient ventilator use across the zone has decreased by 20%, from 128 to 103, in the last two weeks.
 - Zone 3 COVID+ related hospitalizations continue to trend downward across the zone.
 - The number of COVID-19 patients on ventilators has decreased by 24% over the last 2 weeks in the zone from 219 to 165.
 - West Central saw a larger decrease of COVID+ ventilated patients: 2
 38% decrease in WC Region 3 while a decrease of 16% was reported in SW Region 6.
 - The CEN and SW regions remain the highest in Adult Critical Care (ICU) bed utilization across the state.

- Ohio National Guard, 263 soldiers activated for security missions at Corrections Reception Center, Franklin Medical Center, Grafton Correctional Institution, and Lorain Correctional Institution, 77 soldiers activated at 18 institutions to assist with symptom screening missions.
- ODRC has activated 30 soldiers to the Cuyahoga County Corrections Center in Cleveland, Ohio.

Ohio Emergency Mangement Agency

Actions Taken:

The FEMA Public Assistance Program has been declared for COVID-19. There are currently 739 applicants and 187 active projects under the program. There will be a 100% federal cost share for all vaccination projects submitted under the FEMA Public Assistance program. ESF14 is currently working with FEMA to better define eligibility of vaccination cost under the grant program. ESF14 provided this information update during the County EMA COVID call.

15 | Public Information

• Joint Information Center

Actions Taken:

- Pop-Up Testing scheduled at Kent State University (Portage County) today and tomorrow.
- The Central Ohio Vaccination Clinic took place for its second day today in Columbus.
- Ohio COVID-19 numbers for January 28: ODH reports 5,432 new COVID cases. Total cases: 883,716.
- There were 75 COVID-related deaths reported. Total number of COVID-related deaths: 11,006. ODH also reports 256 new hospitalizations, including 23 new ICU patients.
- The updated ODH Director's "Ohio Stay at Home Orders" is posted to the coronavirus website. The statewide curfew is extended until Saturday, January 30th.
- Gov. DeWine and Lt. Gov. Husted held a COVID-19 Update press briefing today:
 - Gov. DeWine noted Ohio schools getting access to vaccines next week have been notified. Tomorrow (Jan. 29), all schools will be notified of which week they will receive their vaccinations.
 - Ohio Dept. of Mental Health & Addiction Services Dir. Lori Criss spoke of the importance of getting children back in schools, not only for academic reasons, but for students' social and emotional connections. School students are experiencing more acute mental health symptoms during the COVID pandemic than normally experienced. The change in routine causes anxiety. Dir. Criss noted Ohio's CareLine, staffed 24 hours a day by licensed behavioral health professionals: 1-800-720-9616
 - Yesterday (Jan. 27) ODH Director McCloud signed a health order pushing back the statewide curfew one hour, changing the time to 11 pm - 5 am. January 27 marked the seventh consecutive day of Ohio COVID hospitalizations staying under 3,500. This curfew is effective through Feb. 11. Today's statewide COVID hospitalization numbers: 2,829.
 - Gov. DeWine noted that the new statewide curfew of 11 pm 5 am starts tonight. The state's hospitalization numbers will be looked at again in two

- weeks to potentially move to a midnight curfew, or eliminate the curfew completely.
- This week's Public Health Advisory System map shows that Hamilton County is no longer Purple (Level 4). Gallia, Hocking, Monroe and Vinton counties remain at Orange (Level 2); the remaining 84 Ohio counties are at Red (Level 3).
- Lt. Gov. Husted reminded Ohioans to support local restaurants. Visit OhioRestaurantsRelief.org for a list of pizza shops participating this week in Pizza with a Purpose. The Ohio Restaurant Employee Relief Fund will receive \$1 for every pepperoni pizza sold this week (through January 31).

 Pandemic with 14 active missions COVID-19 Sample Collection Support: There is one scheduled sample collection mission for today. Daily average of samples collected to date vs forecasted is 69%.

- 2 specialists support the ODH Labs. 110 medical professionals are part of the sample collection teams. 45 personnel provided COVID sample courier services on behalf of the Dept of Medicaid.


