### Executive Summary

In the last 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 3,011 (895,792) total new cases, 8 (6,690) ICU admissions, 54 (11,175) deaths, and 80 (46,215) hospitalizations.

The State EOC is currently at Partial Activation as it continues to coordinate response to COVID-19.

While the EOC is available for use by all Emergency Support Functions, ESFs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, and 15 will remain activated for the ongoing response.

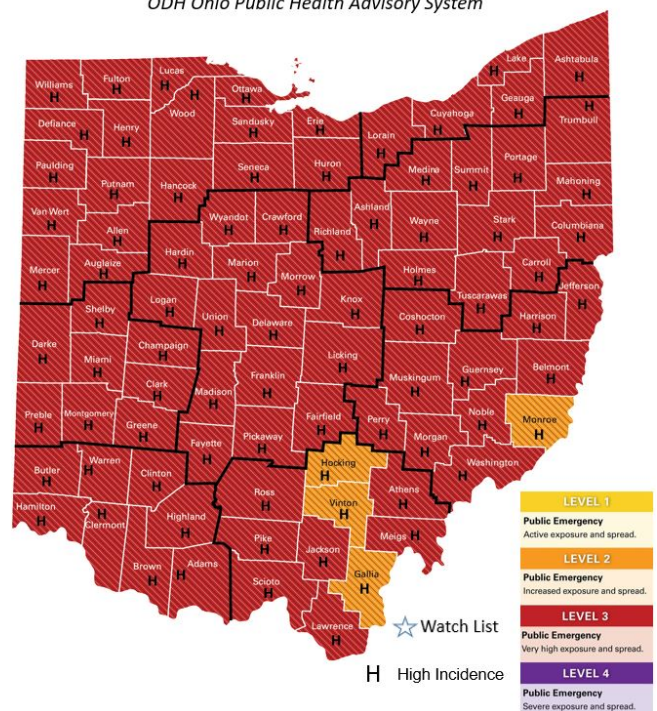

## State Community Lifeline Status

In-state Response | Ongoing External Support | Assistance Needed

### Primary Lifeline



- ODH reports a continued decline in reported cases since late December
- Three active RRF remain in-progress; 14 addressed and are no longer active
  - OHNG Title 32 support has been extended into September, 2021.
  - Eight million nitrile gloves have been requested
  - Battelle CCDS funding is approved through February 28, 2021
- Medical Care:
  - Emergency Department visits are on the decline since late December
  - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supplementing Long-Term Care facility staffing as needed
- Public Health:
  - Ohio is working through phase 1b of its [Vaccination Program](#)
  - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting sample collection and ODH labs
- Medical Supply Chain: Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting the RSS and Adelaide Warehouses
- Fatality Management: ODH assets are deployed and pre-staged to support County EMA needs



- Food: Title 32 OHNG personnel are providing support to Ohio-based food banks
- Shelter: Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues
  - [\(Potential quarantine locations\)](#) have been identified
  - Homelessness workgroup continues to collaborate on response



- Law Enforcement/Safety:
  - ODRC staff and incarcerated population cases are still occurring, but have stabilized
  - State Active Duty OHNG members are providing staffing support to select ODRC facilities
  - ESF-13 is providing site security at select ODH locations
  - First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19. [\(ODH Order\)](#)

  - COVID-positive pediatric patients, however, have increased within the last two weeks; most notably in CEN and NECO regions.
  - The State of Ohio/ODH has filled nine (9) hospital requests for 51 ventilator kits total.
  - There are no pending hospital requests for ventilator kits and there are 949 State owned ventilator kits available.

    - Maintain Surge Deployment Services - providing case interviews, contact interview and symptom monitoring, workflow analysis and improvement.
    - Provide laboratory testing and engage in statewide testing operations as warranted.

- ODRC has 201 incarcerated adults COVID-19 active positives and 128 deaths.
- Ohio National Guard, 196 soldiers activated for security missions at Corrections Reception Center, Franklin Medical Center, and Lorain Correctional Institution, 63 soldiers activated at 15 institutions to assist with symptom screening missions.
- ODRC has activated 30 soldiers to the Cuyahoga County Corrections Center in Cleveland, Ohio.

## Other Partners

- Ohio National Guard

### *Actions Taken:*

- Ohio National Guard continues to provide support to Ohio during the COVID-19 Pandemic with 14 active missions COVID-19 Sample Collection Support: There was one scheduled sample collection mission on Friday.
- Daily average of samples collected to date vs forecasted is 69%.
- 301 ONG personnel work in 14 food banks around the State of Ohio.
- 2 specialists support the ODH Labs.

- 95 medical professionals are part of the sample collection teams.
- 41 personnel provided COVID sample courier services on behalf of the Dept of Medicaid.
- 22 pax are working in the RSS warehouse moving PPE.

*Planned Actions:*

- COVID-19 Sample Collection Support Mission: There are no specimen courier missions scheduled for tomorrow.
- Specimen Courier Transportation Support Mission: There is one sample collection mission scheduled for tomorrow in Franklin County.

- Currently there are 10,896 Active EPCS Credentials.

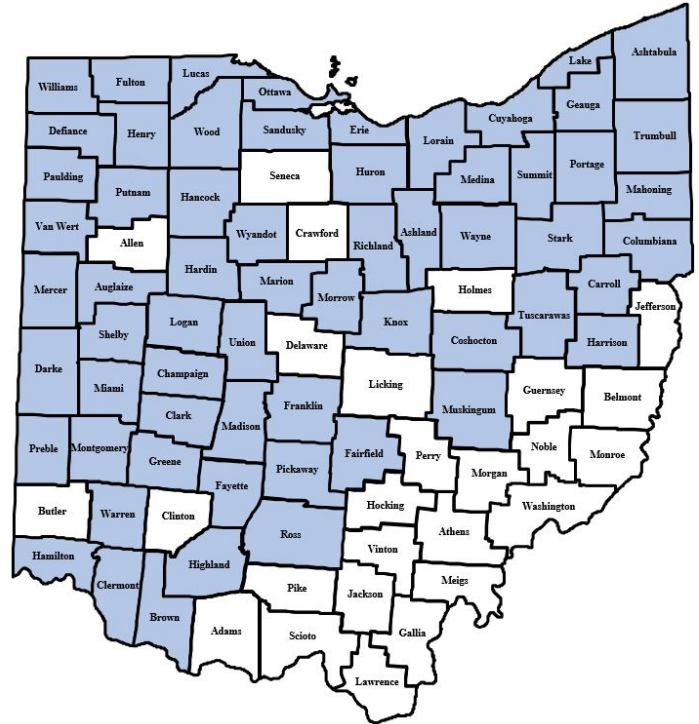

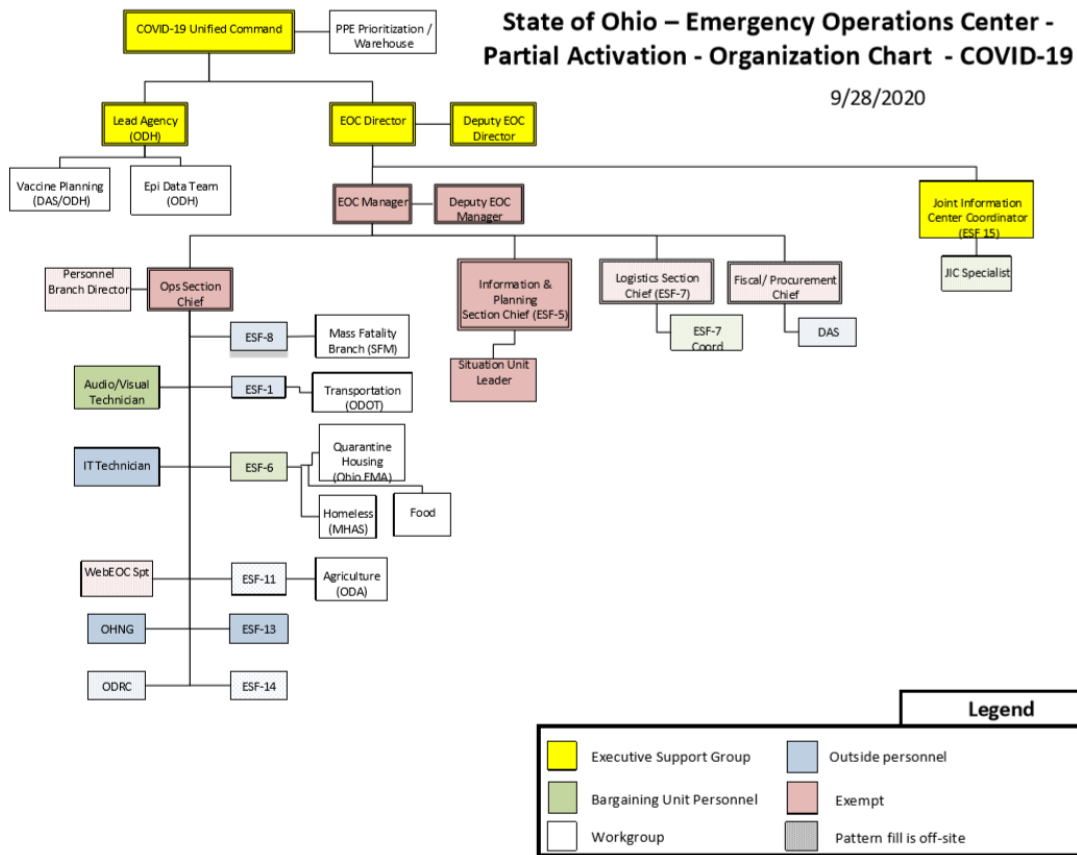
