Executive Summary

In the last 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 3,207 (925,350) total new cases, 22 (6,869) ICU admissions, 98 (11,793) deaths, and 181 (47,853) hospitalizations.

The State EOC is currently at Partial Activation as it continues to coordinate response to COVID-19. While the EOC is available for use by all Emergency Support Functions, ESFs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, and 15 will remain activated for the ongoing response.



State Community Lifeline Status

In-state Response | Ongoing External Support | Assistance Needed

- ODH reports a continued decline in key metrics since late December
- Three active RRF remain in progress; 14 addressed and are no longer active
 - OHNG Title 32 support has been extended into September, 2021.
 - Eight million nitrile gloves have been requested
 - Battelle CCDS funding is approved through March 20, 2021
 - Mass Vaccination Resource Requests (5) have been submitted to FEMA.

• Medical Care:

- Emergency Department visits are on the decline since late December
 - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supplementing Long-Term Care facility staffing as needed
- Public Health:
 - Ohio is working through pahse 1b of its <u>Vaccination Program</u>
 - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting sample collection and ODH labs
- Medical Supply Chain: Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting the RSS and Adelaide Warehouses
- Fatality Management: ODH assets are deployed and pre-staged to support County EMA needs
 - Food: Title 32 OHNG personnel are providing support to Ohio-based food banks
- Shelter: Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues
 - (Potential quarantine locations) have been identified
 - Homelessness workgroup continues to collaborate on response
- Law Enforcement/Safety:
 - ODRC staff and incarcerated population cases are still occurring, but have stabilized
 - State Acitve Duty OHNG members are providing staffing support to select ODRC facilities
 - ESF-13 is providing site security at select ODH locations
 - First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19. (ODH Order)

 - Hospital Zone Updates: Statewide: COVID-19 + hospital patient counts decreased across all three zones. Overall ICU and medical surge bed utilization has increased throughout all three zones.
 - In Zone 1 There was an increase in hospital admissions suspected of having COVID-19 in the NW and NE regions over the last 24 hours. The NE region was the only area that also saw an increase in confirmed COVID positive admissions over the same time period.
 Despite the increase in COVID admissions the zone saw a decrease in patient census of 15 patients (or 1.5%).
 - In Zone 2, COVID + patient admissions increased the last 24 hours but overall COVID positive patient counts decreased in the zone. CEN region saw a 14% increase of med surge pediatric bed usage and SE/SEC saw a 10% increase in ICU adult bed use.
 - In Zone 3, WC saw an increase of COVID + hospitalizations over the last 24 hours while SW reported a decrease of COVID positive patients.

- Ohio National Guard, 141 soldiers activated for security missions at Corrections Reception Center, Franklin Medical Center, and Lorain Correctional Institution, 26 soldiers activated at 7 institutions to assist with symptom screening missions.
- ODRC has activated 15 soldiers to the Cuyahoga County Corrections Center in Cleveland, Ohio.

Ohio Emergency Mangement Agency

- ESF-14 participated in the County Partners COVID-19 Call.
- The FEMA Public Assistance Program has been declared for COVID-19.
- There are currently 739 applicants and 186 active projects under the program.
- There will be a 100% federal cost share for all emergency protective measures claimed under the FEMA Public Assistance program retroactive to January 2020.

• Joint Information Center

Actions Taken:

- Pop-Up Testing scheduled today in Cincinnati for Hamilton County residents, only.
 Next Pop-Up Testing is in Warren, OH (Trumbull Co) on Friday, Feb. 12.
- o Gov. DeWine and Lt. Gov. Husted held a COVID-19 Update press briefing:
 - Gov. DeWine: One of our priorities is to get children back in school by March 1. We are now in our second week for school personnel to receive their COVID vaccinations. After the first week, 566 schools had teachers and staff receive their vaccinations. By the end of this week, Ohio will have more than 1,300 teachers and staff vaccinated.
 - In reference to the state's Executive Budget, Ohio is expanding its investment in the Student Wellness and Success Programs and the wrap-around services they provide to \$1.1 billion. With this flexible funding, individual schools make decisions about what their students need most: mental health services, physical health services, extended learning, after-school services, and addressing hunger and food insecurities.
 - Lt. Gov. Husted addressed the economic impact of Ohio students and remote learning: Students are lacking skills in 20% of reading and 30% of math skills. New pilot program to champion career, technical and vocational education and training, to help high school students and adults find quality, good-paying jobs without the high costs of college.
 - Computer Science Guarantee: Proposing a guarantee for access to computer science courses for 11th and 12th grade students.
 - Rethinking Educational Opportunities: \$900,000 pilot program designed to allow students to complete and receive both a high school diploma and an associate degree within six years, at no cost to them.
 - Gov. DeWine announced the extension of Ohio Rent Assistance that can go toward outstanding balances dating back to March 13, 2020, and assistance for future rent/utility bills for eligible Ohio households. Worked with the General Assembly to request the State Controlling Board to approve \$100 million in federal funding.
 - Ohio COVID-19 numbers for February 9: ODH reports 3,207 new COVID cases. Total cases: 925,350. There were 98 COVID-related deaths reported. Total number of COVID-related deaths: 11,793. ODH also reports 181 new hospitalizations, including 22 new ICU patients.

- Ohio COVID-19 hospitalizations for February 9: 1,974
- Ohio counties' COVID positivity rates are coming down, but still continue to have higher COVID incidence than recommended by the CDC


