Executive Summary

In the last 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 2,806 (931,437) total new cases, 19 (6,908) ICU admissions, 721 (12,577) deaths, and 189 (48,269) hospitalizations.

ODH is currently reconciling COVID-19 deaths, including about 650 in today's count. This primarily impacts deaths occurring from November to December 2020.

The State EOC is currently at Partial Activation as it continues to coordinate response to COVID-19.

While the EOC is available for use by all Emergency Support Functions, ESFs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, and 15 will remain activated for the ongoing response.

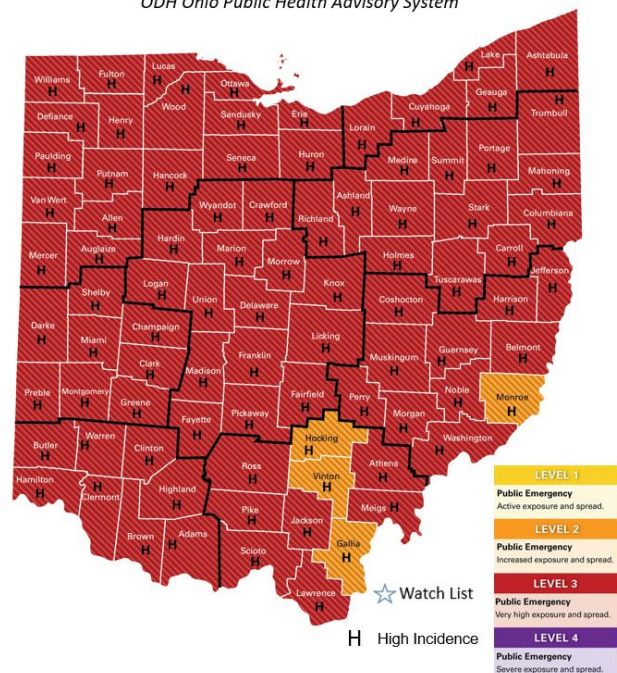

Primary Lifeline



- ODH reports a continued decline in key metrics since late December
- Three active RRF remain in progress; 14 addressed and are no longer active
 - OHNG Title 32 support has been extended into September, 2021.
 - Eight million nitrile gloves have been requested
 - Battelle CCDS funding is approved through February 28, 2021
 - Mass Vaccination Resource Requests (5) have been submitted to FEMA.
- Medical Care:
 - Emergency Department visits are on the decline since late December
 - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supplementing Long-Term Care facility staffing as needed
- Public Health:
 - Ohio is working through phase 1b of its [Vaccination Program](#)
 - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting sample collection and ODH labs
- Medical Supply Chain: Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting the RSS and Adelaide Warehouses
- Fatality Management: ODH assets are deployed and pre-staged to support County EMA needs



- Food: Title 32 OHNG personnel are providing support to Ohio-based food banks
- Shelter: Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues
 - [\(Potential quarantine locations\)](#) have been identified
 - Homelessness workgroup continues to collaborate on response



- Law Enforcement/Safety:
 - ODRC staff and incarcerated population cases are still occurring, but have stabilized

 - Zone 1 -Total COVID+ patient counts within Zone 1 have decreased by almost 20% within the last 7 days from 1128 on 4 February to 945 on 11 February.
 - Zone 2 -Total COVID+ patient counts within Zone 2 have decreased by 15% within the last 7 days from 451 on 4 February to 383 on 11 February.
 - Zone 3 –Total COVID+ patient counts within Zone 3 have decreased by almost 22% within the last 7 days from 681 on 4 February to 534 on 11 February.
 - Statewide across the Zones inpatient beds, ICU beds and ventilator capacity have remained stable throughout the last 7 days.

- Health Care Supply Chain (ESF-7, ESF-8):
 - ASPR/HHS is engaging state primary care association groups for expansion to Federally Qualified Healthcare Centers (FQHCs) via the Special Projects for Equitable and Efficient Distribution (SPEED) program. FQHCs and look alike facilities with on-site administration capabilities may receive monoclonal antibodies (mAbs) directly or partner with nearby hospitals using mAbs that are earmarked for use in the FQHC patients only. To date, 20 named entities representing almost 350 sites, across 10 states are participating in SPEED.

- No timelines yet for the allocation and distribution of the newly approved Eli Lilly antibody combination (Bamlanivimab/Etesevimab). Both drugs will be allocated/shipped together but separate from the current solo Bamlanivimab allocations/shipments.

Update:

- ODRC has 182 active positives staff COVID-19 and 10 deaths for staff members.
- ODRC has 132 incarcerated adults COVID-19 active positives and 130 deaths.
- Ohio National Guard, 141 soldiers activated for security missions at Corrections Reception Center, Franklin Medical Center, and Lorain Correctional Institution, 26 soldiers activated at 7 institutions to assist with symptom screening missions.
- ODRC has activated 15 soldiers to the Cuyahoga County Corrections Center in Cleveland, Ohio.

14 | Recovery

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency

Actions Taken:

- ESF-14 participated in the County Partners COVID-19 Call.
- The FEMA Public Assistance Program has been declared for COVID-19. There are currently 739 applicants and 187 active projects under the program. There will be a 100% federal cost share for all emergency protective measures claimed under the FEMA Public Assistance program retroactive to January 2020.

Planned Actions:

- ESF-14 will continue to provide assistance to partners and grant applicants.

15 | Public Information

- Joint Information Center

Actions Taken:

- Gov. DeWine: More than 50% of Ohio COVID deaths have been of our most vulnerable citizens in nursing homes. Seniors in nursing homes were the first to get vaccinated. The strategy is working. The number of COVID cases in nursing homes has dropped dramatically.
- During the week of Nov. 29, 2020, the number of COVID cases among long-term care residents was 2,697.
- During the week of Jan. 17, 2021, the number of COVID cases among LTC residents was 612. Percentage change of -77.3%
- Hospitalizations continue to go down in Ohio. This may be attributed to nursing home residents getting vaccinated.
- Gov. DeWine: Thanks to a sustained decrease in COVID hospitalizations, Ohio's curfew has been lifted. The statewide curfew expired at noon today. Keep in mind, if hospitalizations begin to rise again, the Dept. of Health may reinstate the curfew. Ohioans need to continue safety protocols to slow the spread and prevent hospitalizations from going back up.
- On the Ohio COVID-19 daily dashboard, 721 deaths were report today, and the total amount of COVID deaths is 12,577. Yesterday, the Ohio Dept. of Health announced that there was a reconciliation issue with its death data. During the coming week, there will be increases in these numbers as ODH works through the process.
- Ohio COVID-19 numbers for February 11: ODH reports 2,806 new COVID cases. Total cases: 931,437. There were 721 COVID-related deaths reported. Total number of COVID-related deaths: 12,577. ODH also reports 189 new hospitalizations, including 19 new ICU patients.
- Ohio COVID-19 hospitalizations for February 11: 1,862
- There is no change to this week's Ohio Public Health Advisory System map.
- Starting next week – February 15, Ohioans born with certain medical conditions or those who were diagnosed in childhood and carried into adulthood will be able to

receive COVID-19 vaccines. The chart detailing Phase 1B of Ohio's Vaccination Program is posted on social media and available on the ODH Coronavirus website.

- Lt. Gov. Husted announced that the Apprentice Ohio program is #1 among the 28 states with state apprenticeship programs, and 4th in the U.S. for the total number of apprentices.
- There are 19,578 Ohioans currently in the Apprentice Ohio program, earning while they learn in fields such as construction, manufacturing, IT, and healthcare.

Other Partners

- Ohio National Guard

Actions Taken:

- Ohio National Guard continues to provide support to Ohio during the COVID-19 Pandemic with 14 active missions COVID-19 Sample Collection Support: There are no specimen courier mission scheduled for today. Daily average of samples collected to date vs forecasted is 69%.
- 334 ONG personnel work in 14 food banks around the State of Ohio.
- 2 specialists support the ODH Labs. 105 medical professionals are part of the sample collection teams. 45 personnel provided COVID sample courier services on behalf of the Dept of Medicaid.
- 22 pax are working in the RSS warehouse moving PPE 24 pax are working in the ODH Adelaide Warehouse.

Planned Actions:

- COVID-19 Sample Collection Support Mission: There is one sample collection mission scheduled for Feb 12, in Trumbull County.
- Specimen Courier Transportation Support Mission: There are no specimen courier missions scheduled for Feb 12. Mobile Vaccination teams are scheduled to administer a total of 525 vaccines throughout Franklin, Butler, Cuyahoga and Trumbull Counties.

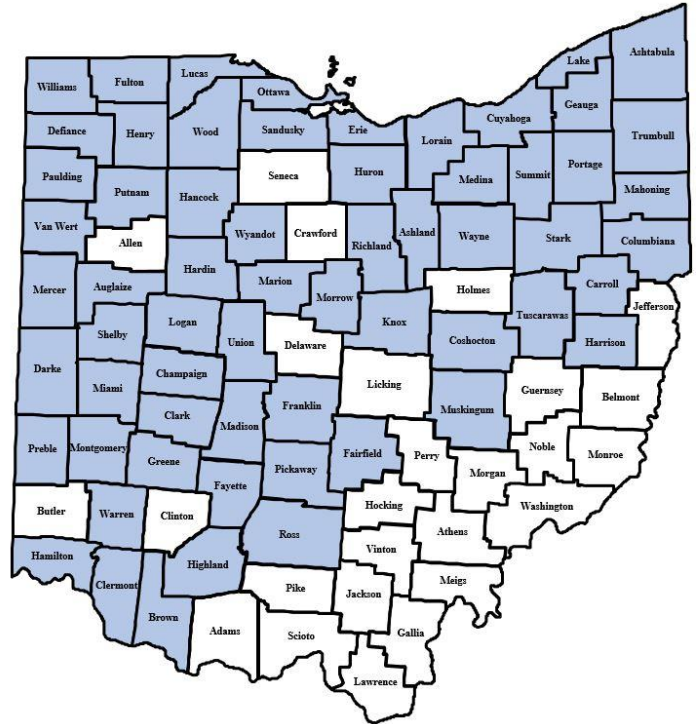

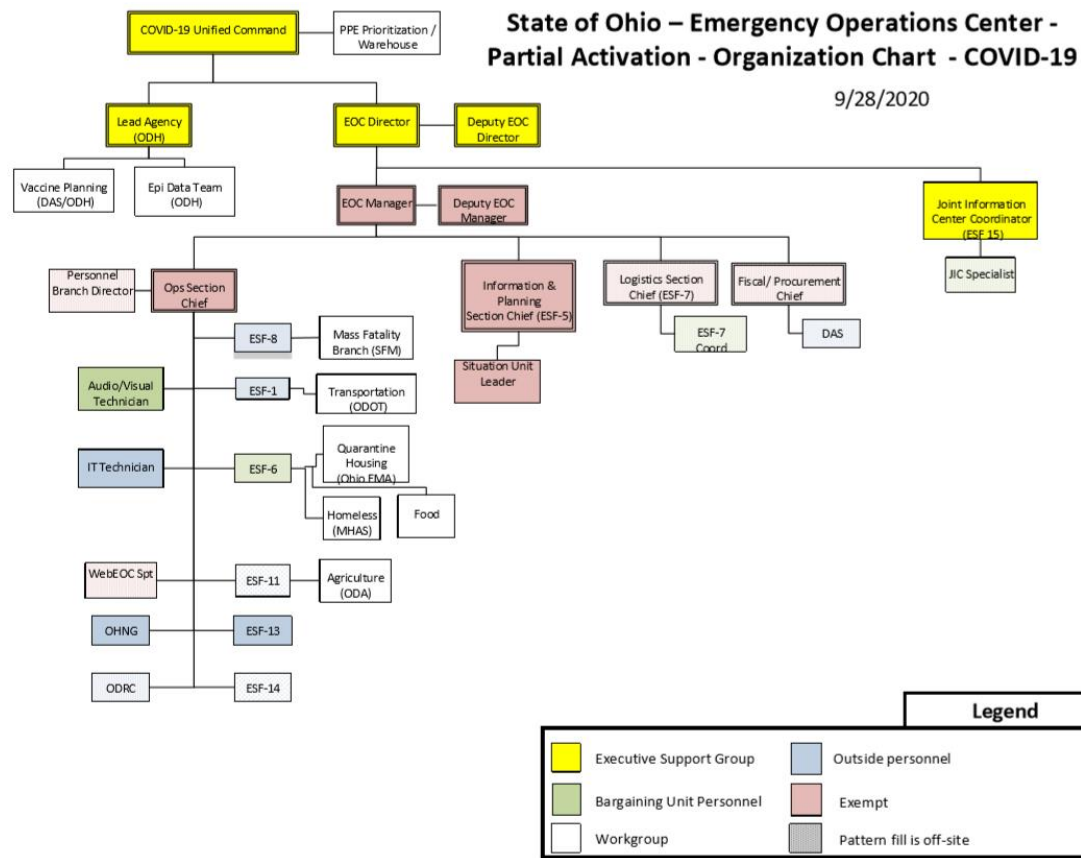
