Executive Summary

In the last 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 2,282 (947,389) total new cases, 28 (7,002) ICU admissions, 98 (16,611) deaths, and 173 (49,061) hospitalizations.

The State EOC is currently at Partial Activation as it continues to coordinate response to COVID-19.

While the EOC is available for use by all Emergency Support Functions, ESFs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, and 15 will remain activated for the ongoing response.

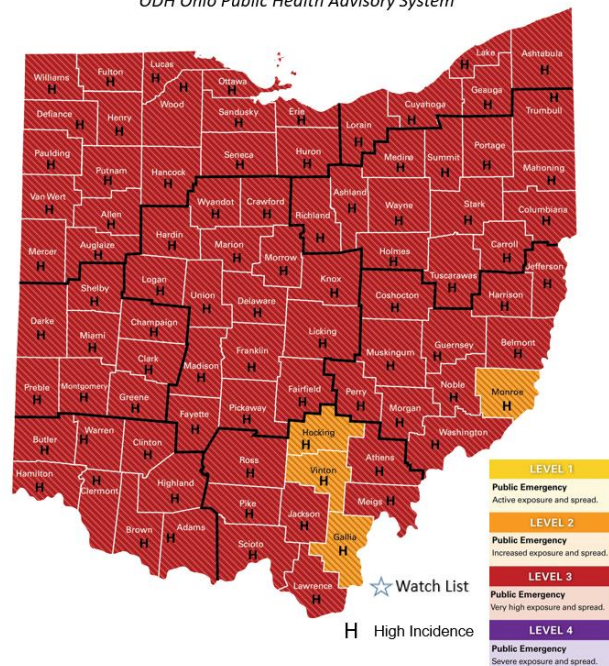

Primary Lifeline



- ODH reports a continued decline in key metrics since late December
- Three active RRF remain in progress; 14 addressed and are no longer active
 - OHNG Title 32 support has been extended into September, 2021.
 - Eight million nitrile gloves have been requested
 - Battelle CCDS funding is approved through February 28, 2021
 - Mass Vaccination Resource Requests (5) have been submitted to FEMA.
- Medical Care:
 - Emergency Department visits are on the decline since late December
 - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supplementing Long-Term Care facility staffing as needed
- Public Health:
 - Ohio is working through phase 1b of its [Vaccination Program](#)
 - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting sample collection and ODH labs
- Medical Supply Chain: Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting the RSS and Adelaide Warehouses
- Fatality Management: ODH assets are deployed and pre-staged to support County EMA needs



- Food: Title 32 OHNG personnel are providing support to Ohio-based food banks
- Shelter: Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues

 - Homelessness workgroup continues to collaborate on response

 - COVID+ patient counts have decreased by 16% across the state in the last 7 days, from 1,798 on 12 February to 1,516 on 18 February.
 - Adult med/surge beds, ICU beds and ventilator capacity have remained stable across the state throughout the last 7 days.
 - There is still an identified need for healthcare professionals, with all three zones reporting anticipated nurse staffing shortages.

- Health Care Supply Chain (ESF-7, ESF-8):
 - The State of Ohio/ODH has filled ten 10 hospital requests for 53 ventilator kits total. There are no pending hospital requests for ventilator kits and there are 947 State owned ventilator kits available - Ohio received 1580 doses of the Eli Lilly drug (Bamlanivimab) for this cycle.
 - Nine hospitals indicated that they would like to be included in the allocations. Due to the low number each facility is being contacted to determine exactly how much of the monoclonal antibodies they want. That number is being provided to AmerisourceBergen to fulfill as responses are received.
 - This is the last allocation cycle through the states for monoclonal antibodies due to excess supply. Facilities will be able to order directly from the distributor going forward.

- ODRC has 114 active positives staff COVID-19 and 10 deaths for staff members.
- ODRC has 149 incarcerated adults COVID-19 active positives and 130 deaths.
- Ohio National Guard, 70 soldiers activated for security missions at Corrections Reception Center, Franklin Medical Center, and Lorain Correctional Institution, 22 soldiers activated at 6 institutions to assist with symptom screening missions.

14 | Recovery

Actions Taken:

- ESF-14 participated in the County Partners COVID-19 Call.
- The FEMA Public Assistance Program has been declared for COVID-19. There are currently 739 applicants and 191 active projects under the program. There will be a 100% federal cost share for all emergency protective measures claimed under the FEMA Public Assistance program retroactive to January 2020.

Planned Actions:

- ESF-14 will continue to provide assistance to partners and grant applicants.

15 | Public Information

- Joint Information Center

Actions Taken:

- Because of inclement winter weather in Lawrence County, pop-up testing initially scheduled for today in Burlington has been rescheduled by the Ohio Dept. of Health to next Friday, Feb. 26.
- Gov. DeWine and Lt. Gov. Husted held a COVID-19 Update press briefing today.
 - In regards to visitation in Ohio's nursing homes: Gov. DeWine expects new guidance to be issued next week. Nursing home residents have received their COVID shots and the number of COVID cases have come down.
 - The Governor noted that Ohio is holding at Phase 1B of the vaccination plan, to ensure that Ohioans ages 65 and older can still receive their COVID vaccinations.
 - Gov. DeWine received word that some individuals with Spina Bifida and Cystic Fibrosis were denied the opportunity to receive their vaccinations because they were younger than age 65. That should not have happened. Individuals with severe medical conditions are identified in Phase 1B of Ohio's Vaccination Program.
 - Gov. DeWine said that vaccine providers will be notified again with the list of who is eligible in Phase 1B.
 - Vinton County is no longer considered to have a high incidence of COVID-19. Vinton is the first county to drop below the high incidence level in quite a while. There are no changes to the Ohio Public Health Advisory System map – four counties remain at Orange, Level 2; 84 counties remain at Red, Level 3.
 - ODH Dr. Vanderhoff reminded Ohioans not to declare victory over COVID too quickly. The vaccines are working very well, but our national vaccination effort needs more time. Ohioans need to continue to slow the spread through masking and social distancing.
 - Ohio COVID-19 numbers for February 18: ODH reports 2,282 new COVID cases. Total cases: 947,389. There were 98 COVID-related deaths reported. Total number of COVID-related deaths: 16,611. ODH also reports 173 new

hospitalizations, including 28 new ICU patients. Ohio COVID-19 hospitalizations: 1,516.

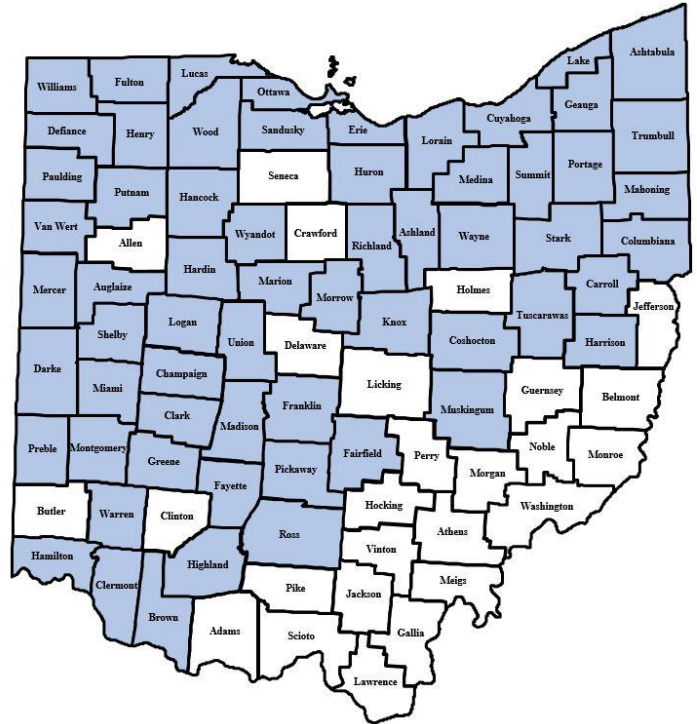
- Ohio National Guard continues to provide support to Ohio during the COVID-19 Pandemic with 14 active missions COVID-19 Sample Collection Support: There is one sample collection mission scheduled for today in Lawrence County.
- 333 ONG personnel work in 14 food banks around the State of Ohio.
- 2 specialists support the ODH Labs. 111 medical professionals are part of the sample collection teams. 43 personnel provided COVID sample courier services on behalf of the Dept of Medicaid.
- 23 pax are working in the RSS warehouse moving PPE 26 pax are working in the ODH Adelaide Warehouse.

Planned Actions:

- COVID-19 Sample Collection Support Mission: There is one sample collection mission scheduled in Lawrence County.
- Specimen Courier Transportation Support Mission: There are no specimen courier mission scheduled.

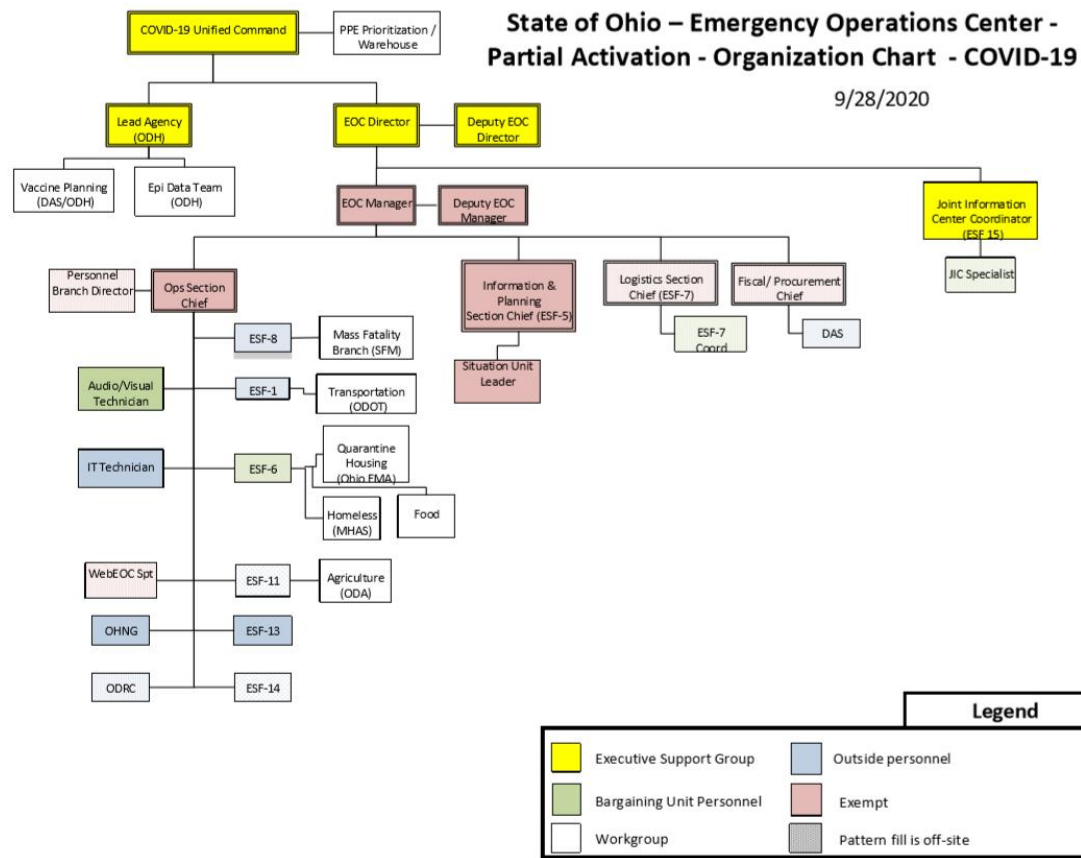
