### Executive Summary

In the last 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 2,775 (958,153) total new cases, 29 (7,073) ICU admissions, 94 (16,968) deaths, and 159 (49,651) hospitalizations.

The State EOC is currently at Partial Activation as it continues to coordinate response to COVID-19.

While the EOC is available for use by all Emergency Support Functions, ESFs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, and 15 will remain activated for the ongoing response.

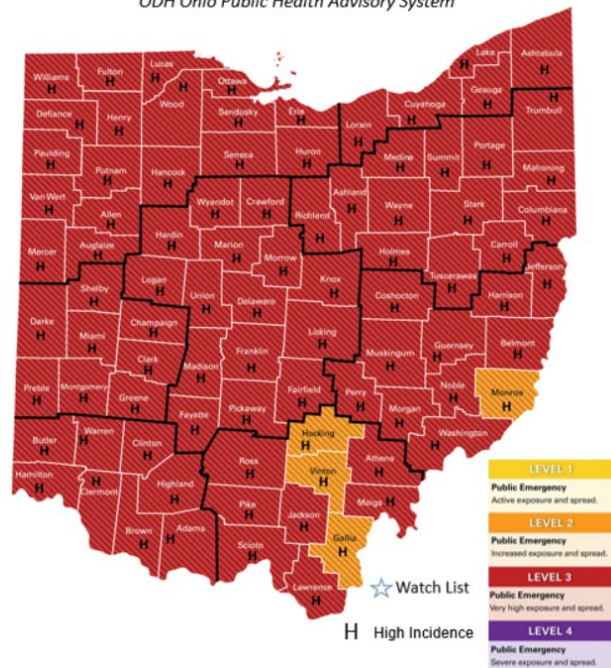

## State Community Lifeline Status

### Primary Lifeline



- ODH reports a continued decline in key metrics since late December
- Three active RRF remain in progress; five RRF are submitted; 14 RRF addressed- no longer active
  - OHNG Title 32 support has been extended into September, 2021
  - Eight million nitrile gloves have been requested
  - Battelle CCDS funding is approved through March 20, 2021
  - Mass Vaccination Resource Requests (5) have been submitted to FEMA
- Medical Care:
  - Emergency Department visits are on the decline since late December
  - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supplementing Long-Term Care facility staffing as needed
- Public Health:
  - Ohio is working through phase 1b of its [Vaccination Program](#)
  - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting sample collection and ODH labs
- Medical Supply Chain: Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting the RSS and Adelaide Warehouses
- Fatality Management: ODH assets are deployed and pre-staged to support County EMA needs



- Food: Title 32 OHNG personnel are providing support to Ohio-based food banks
- Shelter: Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues
  - [\(Potential quarantine locations\)](#) have been identified
  - Homelessness workgroup continues to collaborate on response



- Law Enforcement/Safety:
  - ODRC staff and incarcerated population cases are still occurring, but have stabilized
  - State Active Duty OHNG members are providing staffing support to select ODRC facilities
  - ESF-13 is providing site security at select ODH locations
  - First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19. ([ODH Order](#))

- ODRC has 39 incarcerated adults COVID-19 active positives and 131 deaths Ohio National Guard, 70 soldiers activated for security missions at Corrections Reception Center, Franklin Medical Center, and Lorain Correctional Institution, 12 soldiers activated at 3 institutions to assist with symptom screening missions.

## 15 | Public Information

- Joint Information Center

*Actions Taken:*

- Gov. DeWine ordered flags lowered today, in honor of the 500,000 Americans killed by COVID-19, including nearly 17,000 Ohioans. U.S. and Ohio flags are to be flown at half-staff until sunset Friday, February 26.
- From Gov. DeWine's presser yesterday afternoon: Visitation is now permitted at Ohio nursing homes if the facilities meet federal Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) criteria to allow visits:
  - No new onset of COVID-19 cases in the last 14 days.
  - The facility is not currently conducting outbreak testing.
  - CMS reports the COVID-19 county positivity rate at less than 10%.
- Ohio's second COVID19 Vaccine Town Hall meeting will be this evening at 6:30. Today's target audience is for Hispanic & Latin-American Ohioans. The town hall meetings can be viewed on ODH's Facebook page, ODH's YouTube or online on the coronavirus website.

## Other Partners

- Ohio National Guard

*Actions Taken:*

- Ohio National Guard continues to provide support to Ohio during the COVID-19 Pandemic with 14 active missions.
- COVID-19 Sample Collection Support: There are two sample collection missions scheduled for today in Washington and Hamilton counties.
- The Mobile Vaccination Teams are scheduled to administer vaccines in Cuyahoga and Lucas Counties.

*Planned Actions:*

- COVID-19 Sample Collection Support Mission: There are no sample collection missions scheduled for tomorrow.
- Specimen Courier Transportation Support Mission: There are 32 specimen courier missions scheduled for tomorrow.
- The Mobile Vaccination team is scheduled to administer vaccines tomorrow in Huron, Sandusky, and Allen Counties.

- Currently there are 10,877 Active EPCS Credentials.

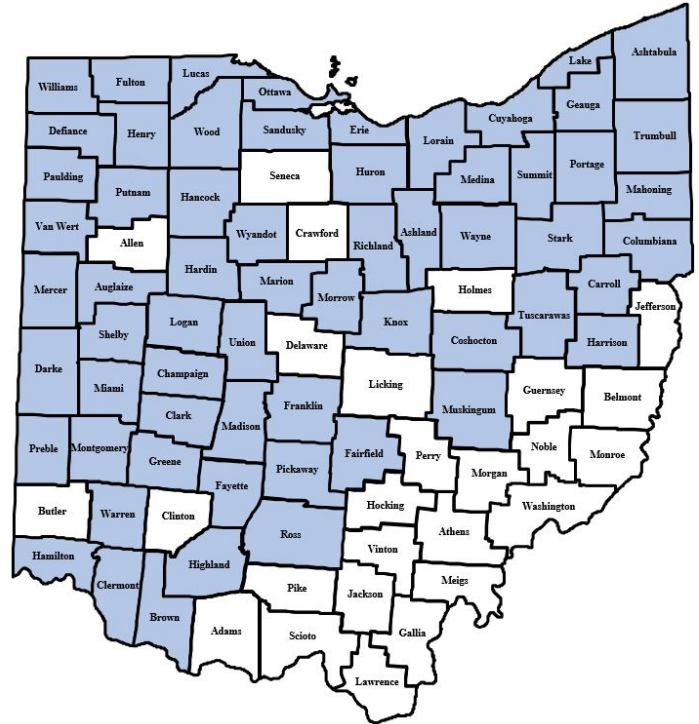
*OP3:*

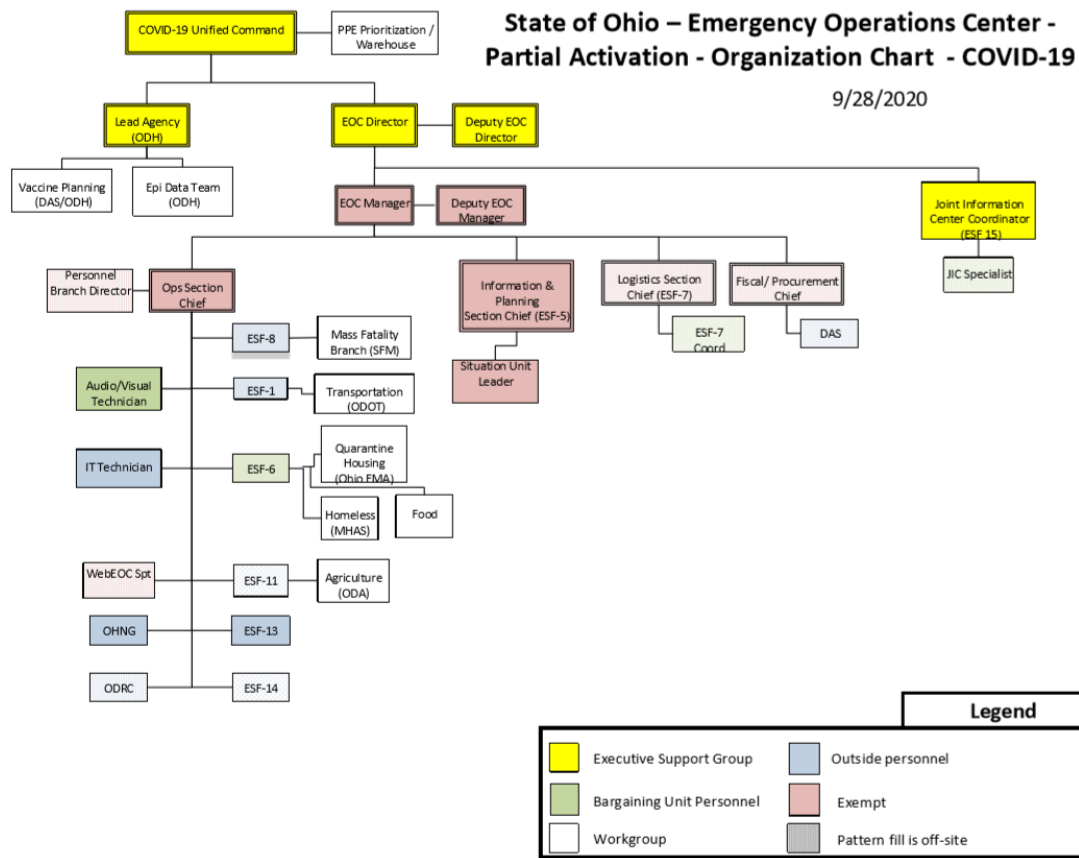
