

Executive Summary

In the last 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 1,709 (970,583) total new cases, 12 (7,160) ICU admissions, and 121 (50,503) hospitalizations. ODH has temporarily suspended its reporting on COVID-19-related deaths as the department transitions to a more reliable processing system.

The State EOC is currently at Partial Activation as it continues to coordinate response to COVID-19. While the EOC is available for use by all Emergency Support Functions, ESFs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, and 15 will remain activated for the ongoing response.

 - There are 1,131 COVID+ patients statewide. This is a 15% decrease in COVID+ patient counts the last 7 days.
 - There were 146 COVID+ admissions over the last 24 hours across the state. COVID+ admissions have decreased 18% in the last 7 days.
 - Overall resource utilization remains stable. Currently the state is reporting 74% utilization for adult Med Surge and 69% for adult ICU beds.
 - Pediatrics Med Surge utilization is at 44% and pediatric ICU bed utilization is at 66%.
 - Ventilator usage is at 30% statewide for COVID and non-COVID patients.
 - Anticipated staffing shortages continue.
 - 48 hospitals are reporting strained staffing for nurses and 2 hospitals are reporting critical nurse staffing shortages across the state.

 - Ohio Dept. of Health Dir. Stephanie McCloud and ODH Chief Medical Officer Dr.
 Bruce Vanderhoff held a media briefing today, via Zoom, to provide an update on the COVID-19 death data reconciliation process in Ohio.
 - Health Orders Regarding Mass Gatherings, Sports, and Entertainment Venues were signed today by ODH Dir. Stephanie McCloud.
 - Today, the Ohio Department of Health is moving to a different mortality reporting method, after failing to timely report more than 4,000 deaths in February. The new method to disclose deaths will result in a delayed, but more accurate count.
 - March 2 COVID numbers: ODH reports 1,709 new COVID cases. Total cases: 970,583.
 ODH also reports 121 new hospitalizations, including 12 new ICU patients.
 - COVID-19 Pop-Up Testing today in Cincinnati. Pop-up testing Thursday, March 4 at Ohio University's Proctorville Center – Lawrence County.
 - Ohio's fourth and final COVID-19 Vaccine Town Hall Meeting took place Tuesday evening. Intended audience is for Rural Ohioans, but all town hall meeting are available to the public. All meetings are available on ODH's Facebook page, YouTube, or the coronavirus website.
 - Yesterday, Gov. DeWine announced that Ohio is receiving 960,100 doses of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine this week. Shipments of the J&J vaccine rolled out on Sunday. Ohioans in Phase 1C and Phase 2 of Ohio's Vaccination Program will be eligible to receive the vaccine on Thursday, March 4. This includes individuals working in childcare services, funeral services, and law enforcement and corrections officers, and Ohioans with Type 1 diabetes, pregnant women, bone marrow transplant recipients, and those living with ALS. Also eligible will be Ohioans age 60 years and older.




State EOC Organization Chart (COVID-19-specific) WebEOC Incident: 00 – OEMA – 20200128 - COVID -19
