### Executive Summary

In the last 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 1,875 (974,480) total new cases, 7 (7,181) ICU admissions, and 82 (50,695) hospitalizations. ODH has temporarily suspended its reporting on COVID-19-related deaths as the department transitions to a more reliable processing system.

The State EOC is currently at Partial Activation as it continues to coordinate response to COVID-19. While the EOC is available for use by all Emergency Support Functions, ESFs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, and 15 will remain activated for the ongoing response.

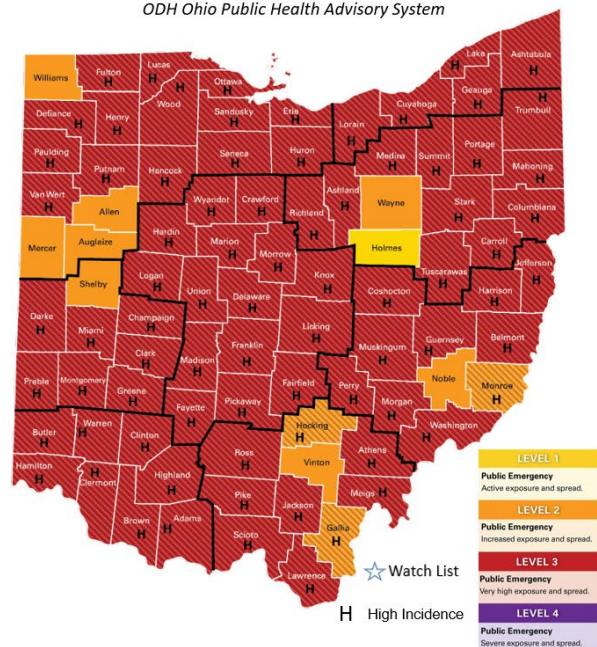

  - OHNG Title 32 support has been extended into September, 2021
  - Eight million nitrile gloves have been requested
  - Battelle CCDS funding is approved through March 20, 2021
  - Mass Vaccination Resource Requests (5) have been submitted to FEMA
- Medical Care:
  - Emergency Department visits are on the decline since late December
  - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supplementing Long-Term Care facility staffing as needed
- Public Health:
  - Ohio continues to move through its [Vaccination Program](#)
  - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting sample collection and ODH labs
- Medical Supply Chain: Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting the RSS and Adelaide Warehouses
- Fatality Management: ODH assets are deployed and pre-staged to support County EMA needs



- Food: Title 32 OHNG personnel are providing support to Ohio-based food banks
- Shelter: Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues

  - There are 1,009 COVID+ patients statewide. This is a 18% decrease in COVID+ patient counts in the last 7 days.
  - There were 155 COVID+ admissions over the last 24 hours across the state. COVID+ admissions have remained stable in the last 7 days.
  - Overall resource utilization remains stable.
  - Currently the state is reporting 74% utilization for adult Med Surge and 71% for adult ICU beds.
  - Pediatrics Med Surge utilization is at 52% and ICU bed utilization is at 69%.
  - Ventilator usage is at 30% statewide for COVID and non-COVID patients.

- The FEMA Public Assistance Program has been declared for COVID-19. There are currently 741 applicants and 192 active projects under the program. There will be a 100% federal cost share for all emergency protective measures claimed under the FEMA Public Assistance program retroactive to January 2020.

## 15 | Public Information

- Joint Information Center

*Actions Taken:*

- Governor DeWine gave a Statewide Address Thursday evening at 5:30. Subject: Progress in the fight against COVID-19.
- COVID-19 vaccinations became available to eligible Ohioans in Phase 1C and Phase 2 of Ohio's Vaccination Program. This includes individuals working in childcare services, funeral services, and law enforcement and corrections officers, and Ohioans with Type 1 diabetes, pregnant women, bone marrow transplant recipients, and those living with ALS. It also includes Ohioans age 60 years and older.
- COVID-19 Pop-Up Testing was available at the Proctorville Ohio University Campus in Lawrence County. Pop-up testing on Saturday at the Jackson County Fairgrounds, and on Sunday in Cincinnati.
- Updated Education and Sector Requirements are posted on the ODH Coronavirus website.

## Other Partners

*Actions Taken:*

- Ohio National Guard continues to provide support to Ohio during the COVID-19 Pandemic with 14 active missions.
- COVID-19 Sample Collection Support: There were no sample collection missions scheduled for March 4.

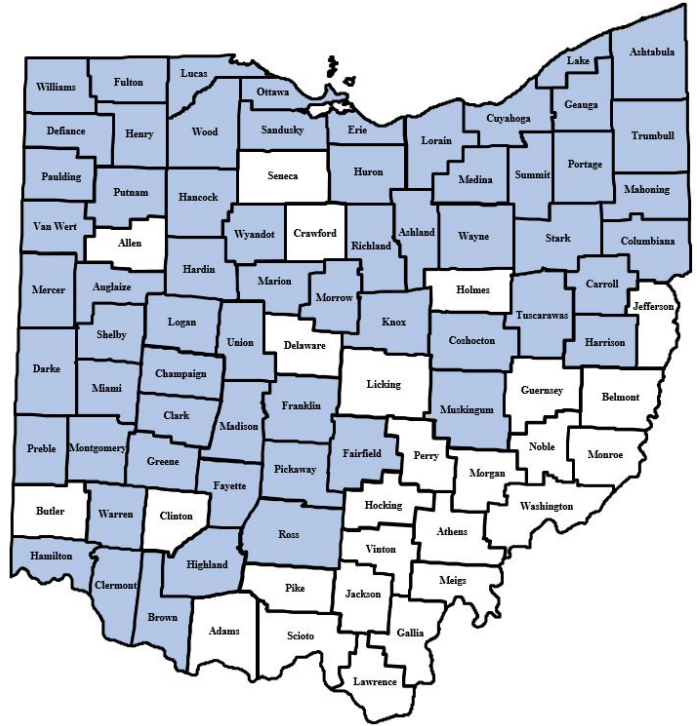

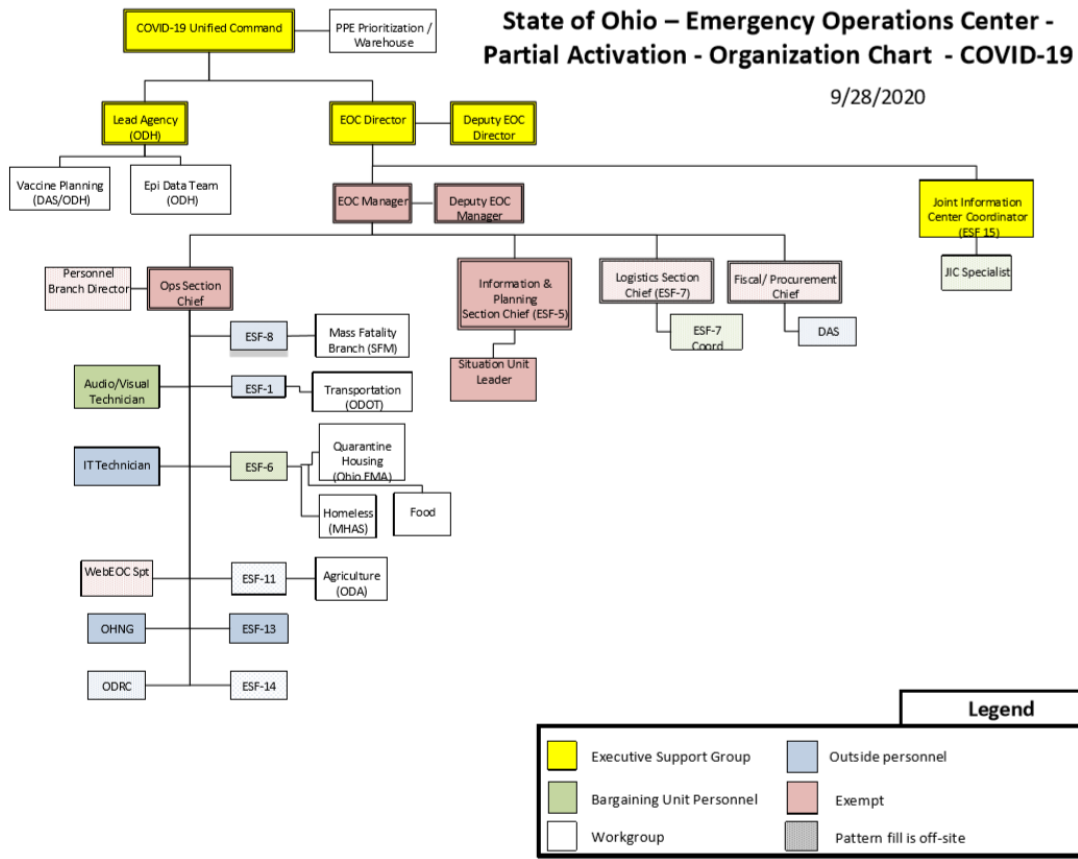
