- ODH reports a continued decline in key metrics since late December
- Three active RRF remain in progress; five RRF are submitted; 14 RRF addressed- no longer active
 - OHNG Title 32 support has been extended into September, 2021
 - Eight million nitrile gloves have been requested
 - Battelle CCDS funding is approved through March 20, 2021
 - Mass Vaccination Resource Requests (5) have been submitted to FEMA
- Medical Care:
 - Emergency Department visits are on the decline since late December
 - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supplementing Long-Term Care facility staffing as needed
- Public Health:
 - Ohio continues to move through its [Vaccination Program](#)
 - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting sample collection and ODH labs
- Medical Supply Chain: Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting the RSS and Adelaide Warehouses
- Fatality Management: ODH assets are deployed and pre-staged to support County EMA needs



- Food: Title 32 OHNG personnel are providing support to Ohio-based food banks
- Shelter: Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues
 - [\(Potential quarantine locations\)](#) have been identified
 - Homelessness workgroup continues to collaborate on response



- Law Enforcement/Safety:
 - ODRC staff and incarcerated population cases are still occurring, but have stabilized
 - State Active Duty OHNG members are providing staffing support to select ODRC facilities
 - ESF-13 is providing site security at select ODH locations

FEMA Community Lifeline Component Updates

Public Health (Primary Lifeline)

- Medical Care (ESF-8):
 - There are 918 COVID+ patients statewide.
 - This is a 24% decrease in COVID+ patient counts in the last 7 days and the first statewide COVID+ patient count below 1,000 since 12 October 2020.
 - There were 126 COVID+ admissions over the last 24 hours across the state.
 - COVID+ admissions have decreased 35% in the last 7 days.
 - Overall resource utilization remains stable.
 - Currently the state is reporting 74% utilization for adult Med Surge and 71% for adult ICU beds.
 - Pediatrics Med Surge utilization is at 54% and ICU bed utilization is at 68%.
 - Ventilator usage is at 30% statewide for COVID and non-COVID patients.

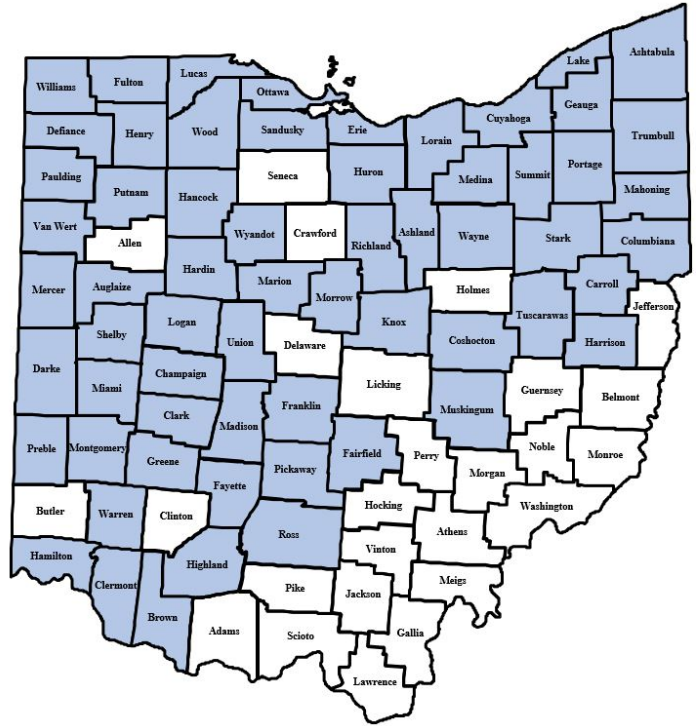
- ODRC continues to work towards incident objectives.

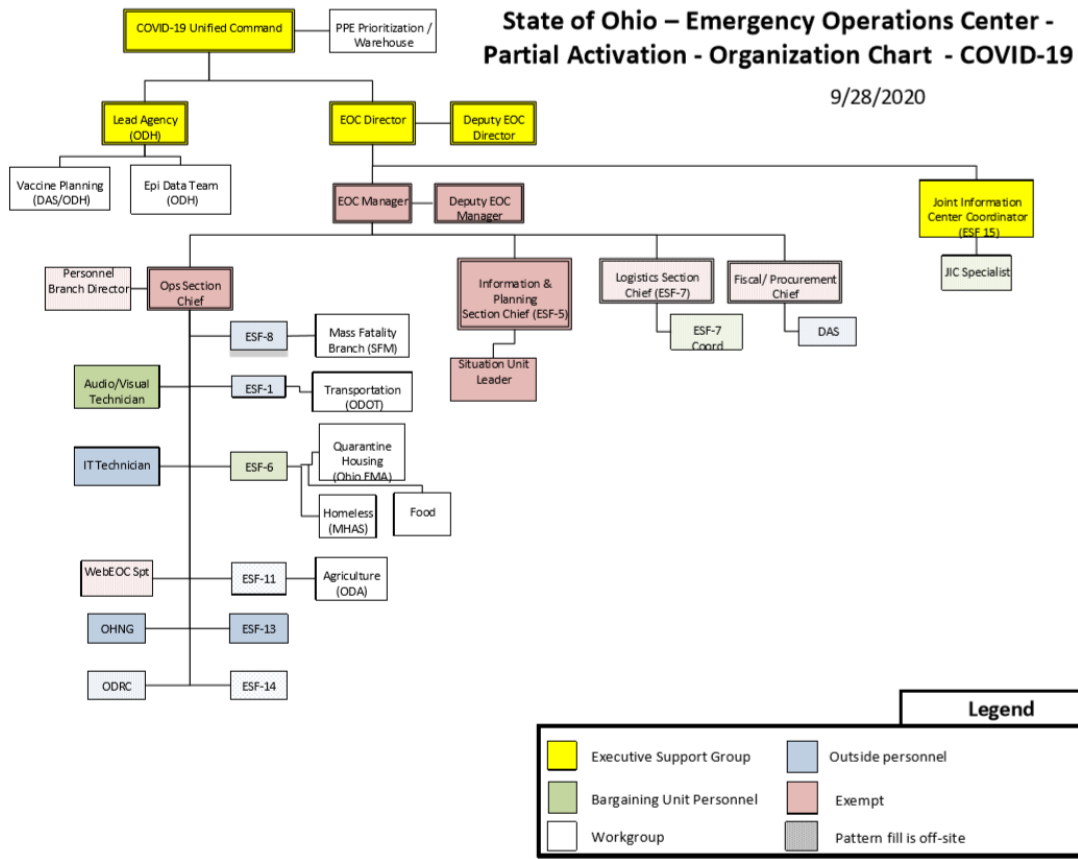
