Current Situation:

Public Health – Dayton & Montgomery County, the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and World Health Organization (WHO) are closely monitoring an outbreak of respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus (termed "COVID-19") first identified in Wuhan City, Hubei Province, China in December 2019 and which continues to expand.

Current Updates:

- MOST IMPORTANT MESSAGE OF THE DAY: DO EVERYTHING YOU CAN TO CONSERVE PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE).
- Montgomery County declared a state of emergency as of today.
- ODH released a Director's Order closing all bars and restaurants. Carryout and delivery are still allowed for food establishments.
- ODH released a Director's Order closing all bowling alleys, health/fitness clubs, indoor trampoline and water parks, movie theaters and all performance theatres, public recreation centers and indoor sports facilities.
- ODH released a Director's Order closing all polling locations in the state of Ohio.
- Public Health COVID-19 informational phone line remains open. It is in place to answer general questions about COVID-19. It is opened Monday through Friday from 8 AM to 4 PM. It can be reached at 937-225-6217.
- Public Health conducted a conference call with high-risk populations (long-term care, hospice, dialysis, home care, etc.) on Tuesday Mar 17th. The majority of concerns involved the need for additional Personal Protective Equipment.



- Premier Health opened their drive-through testing site today at UD Arena. It will be open Monday through Friday from 10 AM to 6 PM. Individuals need a physician's order to be screened.
- Montgomery County is planning on establishing a Unified Command this week.
- Dayton MMRS has created a "COVID for Public Safety" webpage. It is located on the Greater Miami Valley EMS Council (GMVEMSC) website, so no login is required. Here's the link: <u>http://gmvemsc.org/covid.html</u>
- MMRS worked with Public Health to create a personnel screening process for critical infrastructure including police, fire, and EMS.
- GMVEMSC is issuing a Just in Time Standing Order limiting aerosol-generating procedures, directing conservation of PPE, and directing EMS not to transport anyone other than the patient unless an additional person is critical to patient care (e.g., parent of a minor, historian for a stroke patient, or similar).
- ODH information line remains open, the number is 1-833-4-ASK-ODH and is open seven days a week.
- Public Health continues to monitor all sources (ODH, CDC, WHO, European Center for Disease and Prevention and Control (ECOC) for the latest information.
- Public Health maintains its one-week operational period for this response.
- Public Health will continue to share the situational report with other local health departments, Montgomery County Emergency Management, Greater Dayton Area Hospital Association and Dayton Metropolitan Medical Response System partners.

CDC Update (Situation in the US):

CDC is closely monitoring an outbreak of respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus named COVID-19. The outbreak first started in Wuhan, China, but cases have been identified in a growing number of other <u>international locations</u>, including the United States. • The total number of cases and deaths outside China has overtaken the total number of cases in China. From today, total cases from China will no longer be featured separately (former Table 1).








Distribution of COVID-19 cases worldwide
